FEMALES OUTNUMBER MALES IN ENGLAND

Campaign for Emigration of Women to Colonies is Under Way

NEW YORK.—By A. P.—The Salvation Army in the British Isles, working in cooperation with the government is promoting emigration of the approximately 1,250,000 women in excess of male population there. Commissioner David C. Lamb, London foreign secretary of the Army on a mission to the United States, has announced here.

Spinsters and emigration is the fate of these women, the commissioner asserted adding: "We offer no apology for active propaganda designed to procure a better distribution of the sexes. There are a million and a quarter more women in the British Isles today, and one of the biggest after the war tasks assigned the Salvation Army in Britain is to stimulate female emigration and direct it to those colonies in the British Empire such as western Canada and portions of Africa and Australia where there are more male than female inhabitants. The prospect of placing female domestics in the United States has not been overlooked.

FAMOUS FRENCH ARTIST VISITS UNITED STATES

NEW YORK.—Monsieur Raphael Peyre, the distinguished French sculptor, whose latest production, "Cursading for Right," has been purchased by the officers and men of the U. S. Marine Corps, arrived here with his wife on the S. S. Touraine on March 2.

Early last year this famous Paris sculptor announced his intention to fashion from bronze a representative figure of the American crusader of the 20th century. He chose a Marine wearing a trench helmet, displaying the globe, eagle and anchor. This insignia makes the statue typically "Marine" and influenced the personnel of the Marine Corps to purchase it, by voluntary contributions, at a cost of \$11,000.

GOVERNMENTS ARE OFTEN CHANGED IN SPANISH KINGDOM

MADRID, (By A. P.)—Spain has had not less than eight new governments with 50 ministerial changes in less than two years. Last year, alone saw four changes in cabinets with 44 ministerial changes. Virtually every one of these changes was due to the military juntas, or as they are called "Consultative Committees."

These juntas were originally formed to fight favoritism and injustice in the army, the chief grievance of the members being that places on the General Staff were allotted to favor-

ites of the government of the day. One of the first actions of the juntas, which are presided over by the colonels, the highest ranking officers who are allowed to join, was to decide that none of the members should allow their names to be placed in nomination for places on the General Staff.

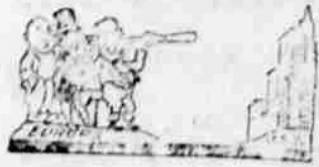
The result would have been that after the death or retirement of the present members there would be no officers to form the staff. But 23 officers refused to be bound by this decision, with the result that they were hailed before courts of honor and their resignations from the army insisted upon. Governments, under pressure from the Liberal, Socialist and other progressive elements in the Cortes, have promised to revoke these decisions of the courts of honor, but found it difficult to do so for the juntas threatened to withdraw their support from the government, in other words, should an emergency arise such as a revolution or social war, the army would be leaderless.

Thus the juntas, became a political force, which opposed radical legislation and otherwise interfered in affairs of state. They are really a great fraternal society, the members of which accept orders only from the presiding colonels in all affairs of the army, ignoring those of king, generals and government.
