WEBSTER'S

TIME FOR TAX RETURNS WILL BE UP MAR. 15

Milton A. Miller, collector of internal revenue, announces that time for filing income tax returns expires on March 15. Anyone failing to comply with the law incurs a penalty of 25 per cent of the tax and a fine as high as \$1000. He therefore urges all individuals and corporations who have not already filed their return to give this matter their immediate attention.

He states that the records of the office show that last year there were 45,000 returns filed, which is positive proof to the internal revenue department that there is yet a large proportion of these returns to be filed.

Last year it was found advisable to allow an extension of time. This year there will be absolutely no extensions except for two reasons—first, sickness, and, second, absence from the state.

Mr. Miller further states that it is the purpose of his office to extend all assistance that it can to people in making out their returns. He therefore urges that they come at once and not put it off until the last day, when it will be almost impossible for the deputies to lend their assistance to taxpayers.

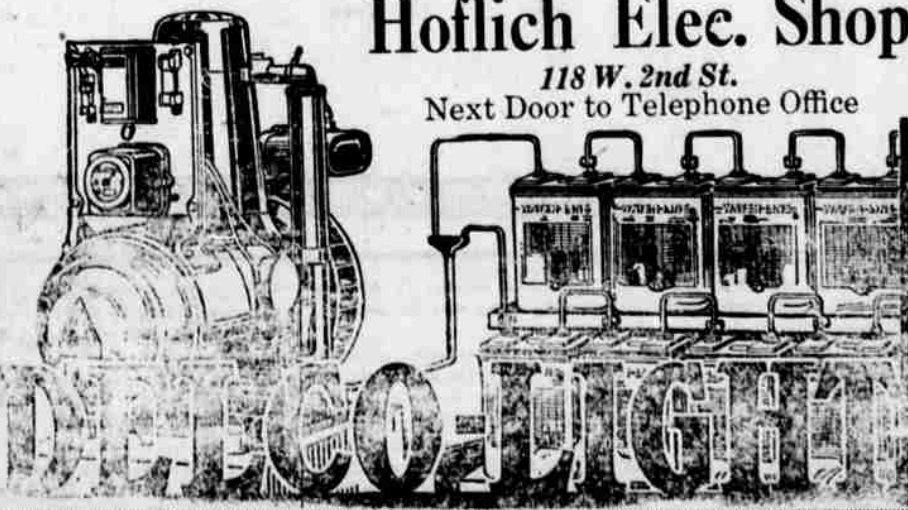
