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WRESTLING TOURNEY STAGED THIS MONTH

SEATTLE, Wash., By A. P.—Wrestling championships of the Pacific northwest division of the A. A. U. will be decided at a tourney to be held at the University of Washington here March 19 and 20 under the auspices of the Young Men's Christian Association.

American Legion Posts, Young Men's Christian Association branches, colleges, universities, Knights of Columbus lodges and other organizations of Oregon, Idaho, Washington, and British Columbia are expected to send their amateur mat men to fight for the titles.

The winners of the events will be entitled to compete for the national amateur championships at a tournament to be held at Atlanta, Ga., during the second week in April.

"ART" MAKES GREAT HEADWAY IN RUSSIA

LONDON,—By A. P.—"Art," so far as the production of pictures is concerned, is said to have had a great boom in Bolshevist Russia owing to the fact that the government pays a liberal amount for all works approved by official experts.

The whole domain of art has been placed under the control of a council of seven members, four of whom are apostles of futurism. Artists' earnings have been increased through a rule established by the council under which all pictures that pass the judges are to be paid for at the uniform of 7,000 rubles each.

Whether the artist has devoted months of assiduous labor to a picture or whether it is a daub which has taken a few hours to paint, the recompense is the same. With such encouragement the number of artists in Russia is increasing rapidly.

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TIMBER DEAL IS ANNOUNCED

NORTH BEND Ore., March 5—(Special.)—Announcement was made Thursday that negotiations are under way by the Buehner Lumber company of North Bend for the purchase of 8000 acres of choice timber land on the north fork of the Coquille river near Fairview from the Field Timber company of Michigan. The tract is considered one of the best in the country and is reported to cruise over 4,000,000 feet of merchantable fir. The price paid is said to \$1.50 per thousand feet or approximately \$600,000 for the tract.

The purchase of the property will give the Buehner Lumber company approximately 13,000 acres of timber land in the Coquille district, and this together with other holdings in other parts of the county, will make the firm one of the largest operating timber holding companies in this section.
