### FLOUR EXPORTS BEING RESUMED

PORTLAND, Mar. 13.—The exportation of flour and wheat to Europe by private interests, idle for the past four years, was resumed yesterday, when negotiations were completed by the Portland Flouring Mills company to send out a full cargo of wheat and flour on the steamer Eelbeck, a 9600-ton shipping board vessel in the European-Pacific line, represented here by the Columbia-Pacific Shipping company.

The exportation of two full cargoes by the Portland Flouring Mills company is considered, therefore, to mark both the passing of the control of the United States grain corporation and the return of Portland's commerce to its pre-war status.

### Prohibition Causes Many to Leave

NEW YORK, Mar. 13.—By Associated Press—Prohibition is causing many foreign born to leave the states according to congressman, Isaac Sigel member of the house immigration committee. Ellis Island records show fifty four thousand arrivals and sixty one thousand departures since Jan-

uary first. Most of the latter have gone to Poland and Czechoslovakia to stay. It is estimated that thirty six thousand will leave and twenty four thousand arrive in March.

Stops will be made only at Junction City, Harrisburg, Gray (Corvallis), Albany, Orville, Salem, West Woodburn, Tualatin and Garden Home. Observation-parlor car and coaches will be carried.  
New Train No. 20, Corvallis to Portland, will leave Albany 4:35 p. m., arrive Salem 5:25; Portland 7:40, making all local stops south of Tualatin.  
Train No. 22 for Portland will continue to leave Albany 6:55 p. m., but will not stop at Pirtle, Wintel, Loewi and Hazelau.
