March 24, 1920 for the construction of an 8" lateral sewer beginning at a manhole to be constructed in the Railroad Street trunk sewer midway between Second and Third Streets and running thence easterly through the center of Blocks 104, 111 and 112 of Hackleman's Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon, a distance of 876.2 feet, or so much of the present lateral sewer in place as shall be found deteriorated to the extent that it needs replacement.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and the ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of Engineer John R. Penland on file in the office of the Recorder where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

LIB CLAMPED ON IN BUENOS AIRES

BUENOS AIRES, —By A. P.—Buenos Aires, which once had the reputation of being a "wide open" city and "gayer than Paris" is "not what it used to be" in the opinion of many travelers who were here before the war and have returned recently.

The gaiety is still here, they say, but it is more decorous and meantime the lid has been clamped upon many resorts in which the worst sort of license was wont to flourish openly. Public gambling places have been also banned, dissolute women have been driven off the streets, and beginning this year the police have begun the suppression of houses of ill fame. The claim is made that Buenos Aires is today cleaner morally than ever before in its history, due to the "reform" regulations of a recent city administration and continued by the present one.

STOCKHOLM, —By A. P.—Adoption of a prohibition platform by a vote of 113 to 105, and passage of a resolution in favor of the separation of church and state, were two of the decisions taken by the Swedish Socialist Party Congress whose labors here have just come to a close.
