Anyway, you have to give Harvard credit for discovering Valparaiso and scheduling a football game with the Indiana team. Yale has never done anything like that.

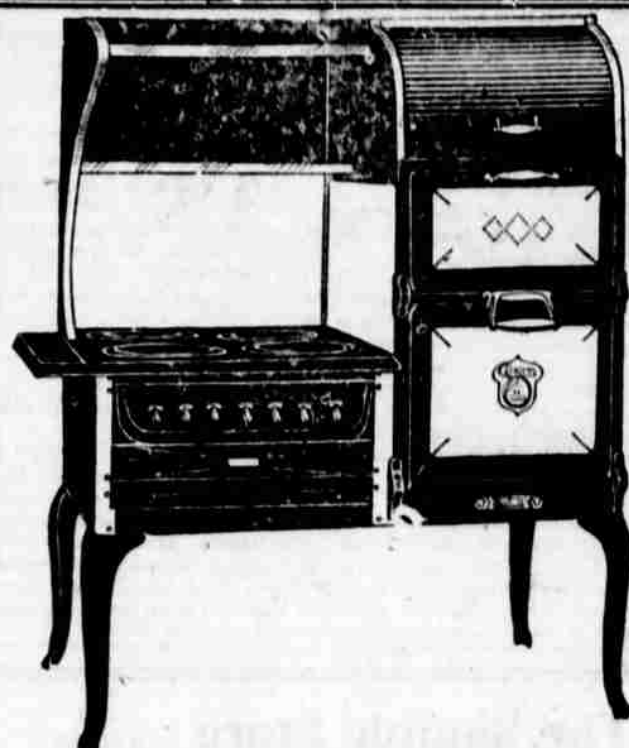
