## FOREST WEEK IS EXPLAINED

The purpose of forest protection week, which takes place May 23-29, 1920, is to enlist the hearty cooperation of every citizen in the important work of caring for the forest resources of Oregon. It is only necessary to look at any of the four million acres of the state which have been fire swept in the past, to realize the fate in store for our wonderful forest if adequate protection is denied them.

Much of the forest area of Oregon is fit for no better use than the production of timber. If left to the mercy of fire, part of the present forests will disappear each year and the land be left a worthless waste instead of a productive area.

There is plenty of timberland in Oregon which grows annually from 500 to 1,000 board feet per acre of Douglas Fir. The Forest Service has records of careful measurement taken on the Siuslaw National Forest, in Western Oregon, which show that during a five year period the timber grew at an average rate of 1754 board feet per acre annually.

Oregon is forging to the front as a lumber producing state. The cut of her mills was two and a half billion feet in 1918. Given the proper forest management, which includes protection, conservative lumbering, and restocking with trees, Oregon's forests

will produce twice her present lumber cut annually for an indefinite period.

## WEDDING GARB CAUSES ARREST

Borrowing a suit of clothes to get married in has proved disastrous to John A. Hess, formerly a resident of Salem and who recently has been residing at Stayton. As a result of the act Hess was arrested by the owner of the clothes and charged with larceny by bailee. Publicity given the arrest apprised Mrs. Hess of Salem of the alleged existence of a Mrs. Hess, No. 2 at Stayton and a warrant for arrest charging polygamy was sworn out against Hess. Hess denies any second marriage.
