FOREST WEEK PLANS ARE LAID

Word has been received by the of Commerce engaged in looking after the Committee of the Portland Chamber for "Forest Week" for Oregon, that several other states are considering similar plans. Among these states are Washington, Colorado, Idaho and Montana.

Never before in the history of the Northwest has there been such keen appreciation of the need for safeguarding our timber resources, for it is realized that we will soon be supplying the bulk of the lumber for domestic consumption and that export trade will also grow proportionately.
