AGGIE BASEBALL TEAM HAS SUCCESSFUL TRIP

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., March 28.—The Oregon Aggies baseball team returned today after their invasion of California, during which trip they managed to break even with the University of California in a two-game series and lost both games to Stanford, score 4-3 and 3-2, each contest being decided in the ninth inning.

The Aggies, with the exception of one day at Berkeley enjoyed excellent weather, and the California sunshine did a great deal to assist in putting them in condition for the balance of their conference schedule.

West Beats East In Tennis Series

BERKELEY, Cal., March 28.—The East vs. West tennis series was won by the West today when Miss Helen Baker of San Francisco defeated Mrs. George Wightman of Boston, national woman singles champion, 2-6; 6-1; 6-4 in the fifth and deciding match.

So close was the play that only one point separated the two players. Miss Baker made a total of 86 points and Mrs. Wightman 85.

MILTON IS WINNER IN SPEED EVENTS

LOS ANGELES, Cal., March 28.—Tommy Milton today won the Los Angeles speedway championship and \$5800 in cash by driving 50 miles on the mile and a quarter track in 26 minutes 52.20 seconds, an average of 118 miles an hour.

Milton led the way across the line in the final heat, nearly a quarter of a lap ahead of Art Klein, who nosed Eddie Pullen out of second place. The winner had held first place from the start.

In the 15th lap Jimmy Murphy winner of the 250-mile race here February 28, started a spurt, which brought him up almost on even terms with the leader, but blew a tire, which lost him a lap and put him out of the running.

Ralph De Palma cut loose in the 29th lap and was almost on even terms with Milton as they crossed the line. On the bany De Palma, too, blew a tire and was a lap and a half behind when it was replaced. Milton's lead was not threatened during the remainder of the heat.

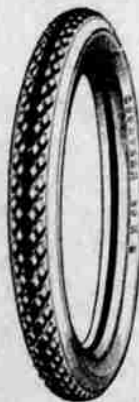

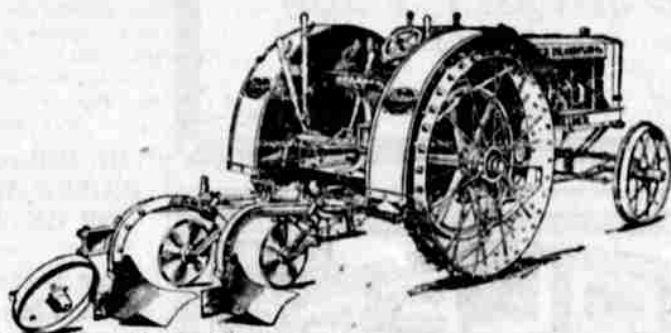
