on the fourth, and Sacramento the fifth.

It is expected that there will be anywhere from 300 to 600 cars in the procession before it reaches its destination. Cities represented will be Seattle, Victoria, B. C., Spokane, Tacoma, Olympia, Bellingham, Everett, Vancouver, Portland and other smaller cities. The run will start from Portland Wednesday morning May 19. A number of tire companies will have special cars in the program. The army will have three trucks of the Motor transport corps carrying officers and a recruiting personnel.

Entertainment of the tourists is being planned for the visitors along the route at the various towns where stops will be made. Service cars will accompany the party to assist machines which come to grief during the trip. Elaborate preparations are being made at Eugene to entertain the travelers on their second night's stop in Oregon. The Portland Ad Club is endeavoring to make arrangements for a portable wireless by which communication with the various cities along the route can be maintained.

Comprehensive arrangements for educational programmes, first-class entertainment and amusement at each of the four overnight stops en route are now in the making. It is planned to provide the convoy with a complete program of moving pictures of interest to motorists and showing the remarkable strides in the development of motor transportation.

There will be reels of boosting good roads and scenic and comedy films as well. This will be supplemented with informative talks by the various firms having home industry entries in the caravan, and the personnel of the advertising clubs will supply the jazz and fun for the evening programmes. These programmes will be held in conjunction with local commercial or civic organizations where the tourists stop.

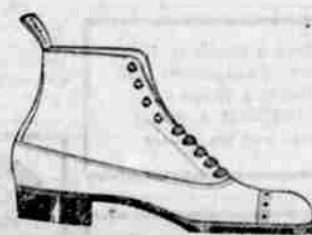
