NEWBERRY WILL AWAIT DECISION

WASHINGTON, March 30.—Senator Newberry of Michigan who returned yesterday, will not resume his seat in the senate until questions as to his status arising from his conviction in the Michigan election conspiracy cases have been disposed of. "I shall not resume my activities in the senate," he said, "until all matters growing out of the proceedings in Michigan are cleared up." Even should Mr. Newberry not participate in any rollcalls, the republican control of the senate by a majority of one would continue, the political alignment being 48 to 47.

MISSING RECORDS ARE DISCOVERED

OREGON CITY, Or., March 29.—Some of the oldest records of the Methodist church that were believed to have been destroyed in the late fire when the church was burned have been found. Rev. E. E. Gilbert, who was transferred to southern Oregon shortly before the fire occurred, had unintentionally packed some of the old records among his books, and the members of the church are jubilant over the discovery. As soon as these were found last week they were immediately sent to this city.

IDAHO HAS BIG WHEAT RESERVE

Boise, Idaho, March 28.—Idaho has today in wheat reserve unsold wheat from the 1919 crop—a total of 2,618,700 bushels, or 14 per cent of the crop. This fact is brought out in a statement on survey of gains in the state by Julius H. Jacobson, Idaho field agent of the government crop reporting service. The other grains; barley, 470,000 bushels; corn, 84,000 bushels. This agent says that the value of Idaho farm land is increasing rapidly each year; the average value per acre being \$41.63.
