U. S. BIOLOGICAL OFFICE MOVED

PENDLETON, Or., Mar. 31—The United States biological survey office for Oregon and Washington, located here since 1915, when the office was established, will move to Portland next Monday, it was announced here today. Offices will be in the postoffice. Stanley Jewett, inspector, is in charge.

The office employs from 20 to 25 trappers in the two states. Inspector Jewett will move also his collection of birds and mammals, the largest private collection in the northwest and exceeded by few eastern collections.

MEDFORD BABY JOINS C. OF C.

MEDFORD, Mar., 31—The week's drive for 400 members of the reorganized chamber of commerce and a \$10,000 budget fund ended Monday with a gain of 401 members and \$5049 of the desired budget. Efforts to raise the remainder of the budget will be continued.

A feature of the closing day's drive was the admission of Barbara Cushing Shelton, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Sheldon, born here Sunday noon, whose application fee and cash accompanying the same was presented by her father, member of the Oregon legislature Monday morning, no doubt making her the youngest chamber of commerce member in the United States.

One hundred business and professional men conducted the drive, divided into divisions and teams. The honors were won by Ben Sheldon's division and the team captained by F. W. Mears.
