

K. OF P. LODGE SIGNS LONG LEASE

Well Known Business Firms
Have Agreed to Occupy
the First Floor.

CONTRACT LEASE WAS
SIGNED LATE YESTERDAY

Hulbert-Ohling and Gilbert Bros.
Will Move to New Location
on Lyon St., Dec. 1st.

Continued from Wednesday, March 5.

That the members of the Knights of Pythias lodge of this city have perfected arrangements for the erection of the handsome temple at the corner of Third and Lyon streets was indicated late yesterday afternoon when a lease was signed for the entire ground floor of the building.

According to plans and specifications the temple will have a frontage of 103 feet and a depth of 134½. The Hulbert-Ohling company have signed a lease for one-half of this space and Gilbert Brothers will take the balance. Included in the plans is a full basement under the entire building and one or more large balconies on the first floor. When completed the temple will cover more floor space than any other building in the city. The two firms who have secured a lease on the lower floor will take possession on December 1st, which is the date set for the completion of the building.

Gilbert Brothers will dispose of their heavy and shelf hardware to Hulbert & Ohling but will retain a small stock of hollow ware for the accommodation of their patrons. They propose to enlarge their stock and will have one of the best and most up-to-date lines of furniture and groceries in the city.

Hulbert & Ohling will not only enlarge their stock but if the present plans are carried out, will continue to conduct a store on first street. Already they have done some jobbing business throughout this section of the valley and with larger quarters available, it is probable that this feature of the business will be given more attention than it has heretofore.

Both firms are well established in the business circles of Albany and an increase in business has made larger and more commodious quarters absolutely essential.
