This saving in the cost of transporting apples to market was made because the services of the refrigera tor companies were dispensed with It cost 10e a box for rail refrigerator to the east and 12 1-2 cents additional for refrigerator to Europe. This is a total cost of 22 1-2 cents a box and in some instances is the dividing line between profit and loss to shippers.

Up to this time practically all of the Jonathans and other soft fruit was sent out from the Pacific Northwast under refrigeration. That was the old system and it was generally accepted up to this season as the proper method.

The Northwestern Fruit Exchange shipped 80 cars of apples to the German market alone this season, there-
