

ELECTION JUDGES AND CLERKS NAMED

County Court This Morning Announced Boards to Serve 54 Precincts.

TWO WOMEN APPOINTED TO SERVE ON EACH BOARD

List Will Be Posted for Objection and Revised After 3 Months.

Continued from Wednesday, Jan. 28

Naming two members of each board to serve the 54 precincts of Linn county, through a desire to permit the fairer sex to have a hand in affairs, the county court today announced the judges and clerks for the coming election. One hundred and eight women of Linn county, thus have been selected to serve on election boards. Some are named as judges and others as clerks. There are three judges and three clerks on each board.

The list will be posted in County Clerk Marks' office for three months, for the interposition of objections. At the end of that time the list will be revised and notices will be sent out. Only one board for each precinct is announced, with the exception of one. Should the services of a second board for any precinct become necessary through the indication of heavy registration, the county court will name another when the list is revised.

I. R. SCHULTZ DESERTS LOCAL PROGRESSIVE RANKS

Secretary of County Committee Approves of Administration; Registers As Democrat.

I. R. Schultz, secretary of the Progressive County Central committee, one of the three delegates from Linn county to the Progressive state convention at Portland, editor of the Progressive newspaper published at Albany last November, secretary of the Linn county Progressive club and one of the best known and most active members of the Progressive party in this section of the state during the recent campaign, has renounced allegiance to Ex-President Roosevelt and today registered with County Clerk Marks as a Democrat.

When asked by a Democrat representative if it were true that he had registered as a Democrat, Mr. Schultz replied in the affirmative.

"I have come to the conclusion," said the former Progressive worker, "that President Wilson and the Democratic members of congress have made good on each and every pledge contained in their national platform. The tariff and currency laws have been passed and they are both meritorious measures which are drafted in the interests of the masses. Business has not been injured as a result of the passage of these laws and on the contrary shows many signs of marked improvement.

"While I have always admired, and still admire the personality of Colonel Roosevelt, I am firmly of the opinion that President Wilson has made a better president than either Roosevelt or Taft.
