To add to his troubles, he has met with two annoying incidents during the past week. One is a dispute with the Sumpter Valley road over freight charges on six carloads of lumber from the Bridal Veil mills, which has arrived and for which customers are clamoring. He will not unload it until the matter of freight the box of ter Valley road over freight charges on rate is settled. The other is that he has had to shut down his mill for repairs for a few days. Just as soon, however, as the differences with the railroad are adjusted, lumber will be rushed in from the outside and the local trade taken care of, and Mr. Stoddard knows how ro do it.
