Mine Sold Last February for \$65,000-Jimmy Fain Perished on the Divide While Carrying the Good News to His Partners -A. L. McEwen Now in Charge of the Property for the New Owner.

After dozens of rumors from as many sources, it can now be definitely stated for & Co. a fact that the Ibex mine has passed into new hands. The first cash payment, a substantial one at that, was made last Friday and the deed placed in escrow.

The new owner of this valuable property is Colonel S. W. Ray, a resident of Port Arthur, Canada, but who has been in this city and district since October 17, on a mission which is now partially accomplished by this new acquisition, though he has in the brief time since coming here secured other holdings, among which are the White Elephant and three or four other properties. Only ten days ago A. L. McEwen purchased the Little Jessie fraction for him, adjoining the White Elephant, from O. Hemerstein, of Sumpter.

Under the able management of Mr. McEwen, who took full charge of the Ibex Monday, the work will go forward without interruption, and it goes without saying that this formerly well managed mine will continue to be known as one of the big things of the Sumpter district, as its ore values are equal to any ever found

The consideration for the purchase of the lbex was \$300,000, a sum said to be

the Ibex was \$300,000, a sum said to be very modest for so very valuable a property, and Colonel Ray is to be congratulated on becoming its possessor.

The Ibex was bought by S. S. Chapman and Arthur Hill, the latter of Michigan, last February, for \$65,000. Then it was that poor Jimmy Fain lost his life while carrying the good news of the sale to his partners, who had stayed with the mine for years, enduring hardships and privations. He encountered a storm while privations. He encountered a storm while crossing the divide, which froze the joy in his heart and he never received the reward for his long labor on and loyalty to a property he knew to be "good."

Mr. Chapman and his associates have other mines in the district which they are developing.

HOW TO DETECT GOLD.

This New Method Doesn't Abolish Assayer's Occupation.

A new method of detecting the presence of a small quantity of gold has been recently discovered by Dr. Ohler. By this method the presence of quantities as low as 77 centigrammes per ton may be established. The operation is as follows:

A quantity of finely powdered ore, say 120 grammes,, is introduced into a flask. To this an equal volume of tincture of iodine is added, and the mixture well agitated. It is then left for an hour, agitatlowed to stand. When the solution has separated, a band of filter paper is saturated with this, and the paper allowed to dry. This operation is repeated five or six times in succession, in order to completely saturate the paper. It is afterward calcined, and it will be observed that the ash, when gold is present, offers a purple color. This color should disappear quickly if the ash is moistened with bromine water.

The test may be modified in the following manner: A quantity of the powder, 120 grammes, is covered with bromine water, and after agitating during the course of an hour, the solution is filtered.

Upon adding protochloride of tin to the TIMBER LAND, ACT JUNE 3, 1878.solution, it takes a purple color, in the presence of gold, giving the reaction known as "Purple of Cassius." In the case of sulphides the ore should be previously roasted, and when the mineral contains a considerable proportion of car bonate of lime, it should be calcined in he presence of ammonium carbonate.-Scientific American.
