BACHE'S BRICK BLOCK

Most Imposing and Substantial in the Town.

The Bache Hardware company's brick building on Mill street is about finished. It is decidedly the handsomest business block in camp, and would be a credit to any town. Though it has a frontage of only twenty-five feet, it is in every respect a metropolitan appearing structure. It covers the entire length of the lot, 100 feet; has a sixteen-foot ceiling in the first story and twelve feet in the second.

There is nothing showy about the front, but there is an unmistakable air of substantial solidity about it, that is materially enhanced by the large plate glass window lights. Each of the front windows have sashes 126 by 156 inches in size, the lower light being 84 by 96 inches, with two above, each being 42 by 60. The side window sashes, between the door and front windows, set at an obtuse angle, are 48 by 156 inches in size, divided into two lights, the lower one being 96 and the upper one 60 inches in length.

The entire first floor is in one store room, in the rear of which, half way to the ceiling is a twelve-foot wide gallery from wall to wall. This will have a front entirely of glass and will be used as an office. It will be two or three weeks before the store will be occupied, as it will require about that time to make the fixtures, consisting very largely of drawers, as well as shelving, such being necessary in the hardware trade.

The second story will be reached by a stairway yet to be constructed, on the inside of the adjoining wooden building, now and in future to be occupied by the Hardware company. The telephone office will be moved to one of the front offices,

and the others will be for rent.
This building cost about \$11,000.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

Fourteen Saloon and One Music Hall Licenses Granted.

At the meeting of the council Saturday evening Alderman Ellis occupied the chair, in the absence of Mayor Gleason. Fourteen saloon and one music hall licenses were granted.

The resignation of Alderman Austin, to take effect the ninth instant, was received and accepted. On that date he will be in stalled as marshal, to which position he was elected at the recent municipal election. The names of P. D. Healey and Clark Snyde are mentioned in connection with the vacancy in the council.

A petition was presented asking that Dr. Brock be appointed city physician. The matter was laid over for one week.

Two ordinances were introduced; one amending the ordinance defining the duties of town treasurer, and the other recorder.


