**Buying Fresh Stock and New Equipment For Stage Lines.**

Tom McEwen and W. H. Cade, of the Sumpter Transportation company, left here yesterday morning for the Grande Ronde valley, to purchase more horses for their stage lines and freighting outfits. This company had fifty head of stock driven in from the John Day country only a few days since, which with the five new Henderson stage coaches, several new hacks, buggies and buck-boards, will put its service in first class order, both in the livery department and on the stage lines.

The offices, baggage and storage rooms for small wares will be moved into the company's new building on Center street by the end of this week or the middle of next.

The large platform street scales for weighing hay, grain and wagon loads of merchandise has been removed from the old site at the corner of Center and Granite streets and put in place on Sumpter street, next to where the office will be.

The general improvement in the affairs of the newly organized stage company is decidedly noticeable and the well filled stages going and coming every day is an evidence that the people appreciate its efforts to give a good service, as well as a sure indication that the country is filling up with the prospector, mining operator, and traveller in general.

**END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.**

The city schools close Friday. The total enrollment for the session is 230, as against 140 last year. THE MINER on several occasions has pointed out why the school attendance and census are not adequate evidences of the increase in

The schools will not give any pretentious commencement exercises. Miss Myers, the principal, desires that the parents of pupils be at the school room from one to half past two Friday afternoon, when some exhibition of the work accomplished during the session will be given. At 2:30 a short program will be presented in the church, to which the public is invited.

The principal says that everything connected with the school management during the year has been of the pleasantest nature and she desires to thank both the trustees and patrons.

The next session will begin in September, with the same corps of teachers, the Misses Myers, Miss Terry and Miss Vanderburg.
