ORDINANCE NO. 8.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF POUNDMASTER AND TO PREVENT CERTAIN ANIMA'S FROM RUNNING AT LARGE, OR FROM BEING HERDED IN OR UPON ANY OF THE STREETS, ALLEYS, UNINCLOSED GROUNDS OR PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMIT. OF THE TOWN OF SUMPTER, BAKER, COUNTY, OREGON, AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOUNDING AND SALE OF ANY SUCH ANIMALS, AND FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF PERSONS FOUND GUILTY OF ALLOWING SUCH ANIMALS TO RUN OR BE HERDED THEREIN OR THEREON.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the Town

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the 1000 of Sumpter:
SECTION 1. That the office of Poundmaster of the Town of Sumpter, Baker county, Oregon, be and the same hereby is created, and the Common Council of said town authorized and empowered to fill such office by appointment of any suitable person who will accept the same.

SECTION 2. That no horse, mare, mule, gelding, jenny, jack, cow cell, steer, belier, bull, burro, sheep, hog or goat shall hereafter be allowed to run at large, or be herded in or upon any of the streets, alleys, uninclosed places or public grounds within the corporate limits of the Town of Sumpter, Baker county, viegon, during any of the hours of the day or night, except when being driven through the said town for shipment or other lawful purpose or purposes.

SECTION 1. It is hereby made the duty of the Poundmaster, or any policeman or nightwatchman of the Town of Sumpter, to take up any of the animals mentioned in section two (2) or this ordinance found running at large or herded within the corporate limits of said Town, or upon any of the streets, alleys, undisclosed places or public grounds therein, and impound them in such place as shall be designated or provided by the Town therefor.

SECTION 4. Upon taking or impounding any animal under the provisions of this ordinance, the Poundmaster of the Town of Sumpter shall fortiwith prepare four notices, which shall be substantially as follows, to wit:

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that I did on the ...day of ...day in front of the City Hall of the Town of Sumpter sell said property at public auction to the highest cidder therefor for cash.

One of which said notices shall be filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town; another thereof shall be posted on the bulletin board in front or the City Haif in said Town; another thereof shall be posted at the front door of the Postoffice in said Town, and the other thereof shall be placed in the Postoffice at the Town of Sumpler addressed to the owner or owners of said animal or animals so taken up, if the Postoffice address of such owner or owners is known to the Poundmaster.

SECTION 5. That within not less than five days or more than ten days after the said notices shall have been posted as aforesaid, and placed in the Postoffice as aforesaid, and pursuant to the terms thereof, the said animal or animals so taken up and imponing to the city Hail in the Town of Sumpler, self the said animal or animals so taken up and imponinged to the highest Eldder for cash, unless such poleedings shall be taken as is in this ordinance otherwise provided.

Poundmaster shall, at public, auction in front of the City Hall in the Town of Staspher, sell the said animal or animals so taken up and impounded to the nighest tidder for cash, unless such pro-endings shall be taken as is in this ordinance otherwise provided.

SECTION 6. Any one having an interest in the property so taken up and impounded, who shall teel interest in the taken property, and the facts in the Recorder of said town an allidavit, setting forth therein his interest in such property, and the facts in relation to the taking up and impounding thereof, together with any other facts which would be meteral in determining whether the said property was subject to be taken up and impounded under the provisions of til ordinance: immediately thereafter the said affectorler shall set a time certain for the determination of said facts, which said time shall not be less than one day for more than three days thereafter, provided that the said agritived party. The Recorder of the Town of Sumpter shall be entitled to receive as fees for duties required of him by the provisions of this ordinance the sum of ten cents to filing the notice of sale, twenty-live cents to filing and entering the certified slatement of the Poundmaster, fifty cents for docket entities in any one case, and two dollars and filty cents for bearing and electroning and contested case, which sum of two dollars and this cents shall be paid by the contestant is advance.

SECTION 12. Any person or persons found guilty of violating the pao issums of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereat before the Recorder te fined in any sum not less than they not more than ten dollars and in default of the payment of such the and costs be imprisoned in the city jait not exceeding one day for each two dollars thereof.

SECTION 12. The owner or owners of any property sold under the provisions of this ordinance shall, at any time within one year from the date of sale of such property, upon saltsfactor, proof to the Common Council of the sald Town of such ownership, be entitled to a warrant upon the city treasury for the net proceeds of such sale so deposited as aforesaid.
