## Lawton's New Hotel

Advices from Pendleton convey the pleasing intelligence that the new Lawton hotel will be under course of construction within ten days or two weeks at the longest. Mr. T. F. Howard, the Pendleton architect who has been entrusted with drafting the designs and specifications, reports that he has about finished his task and will be ready to submit them for approval to the board of directors of the hotel company by the latter part of this week.

The new building is to be of modern design and finish, and will be furnished throughout from cellar to garret with the best furniture, tapestry, etc., obtainable. As yet the management of the hotel has not been decided upon, but it is understood the officers of the Investment company are negotiating with a thoroughly practical man for the position.—Lawton Standard.

## Driving Tunnel Towards Comstock Ledge.

The Comstock group of claims situated a mile above Lawton, on Clear creek, is one of the promising properties of this section. 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
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
