PLANS OF S. V. ROAD.

Supplementary Articles of Incorporation Filed.

At a meeting of stockholders of the Sumpter Valley road, held July 14, supplementary articles of incorporation were adopted and ordered filed. Article II of the original document was so amended that the duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

Article III was so amended as to read: "The business of this company shall be to construct, equip, operate and maintain a line of railroad and a telegraph and telephone line from Baker City, in the state of Oregon, to Burns, in the state of Oregon, following the present railroad line of this company from Baker City, Oregon, to Sumpter Valley, in Baker county, Oregon; and from thence to a point on Burnt river in Baker county, Oregon; and thence by the most practicable route such as the board of directors may hereafter select from said point on Burnt river to Burns or some suitable point in Harney county, state of Oregon; together with all necessary and appurtenant branches, spurs, switches and sidings, depot facilities and appurtenances.

"To carry freight and passengers over said lines of railroad, and to receive and deliver messages over said telegraph and telephone lines, and to receive tolls for the carriage of freight and passengers and for the transmission of messages.

"To purchase or lease lands, whether adjacent or contiguous to its railroads or not; and to hold, possess, improve, lease, sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of such lands in such manner as may be

deemed fit; to acquire, purchase, lease and operate any other railroads and railway lines and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any or all of the property of this company.

"To borrow money on bonds, notes or otherwise, for the purpose of construction and for the general purposes of this company; and to mortgage its railroads, telegraph lines, telephone lines, franchises, rolling stock, right of way and any and all other property to secure the payment thereof; to do any and all other things necessary or proper for the accomplishment of the objects above specified."

And amending Article V of said articles of incorporation so as to read as follows:

"The capital stock of this corporation shall consist of 15,000 shares of the par value of \$100.00 each; 2500 shares of which have already been issued, covering the road from Baker City to McEwen, and the remainder of said stock is to be issued at the rate of one hundred shares for each mile of road now or hereafter to be constructed from McEwen to Burns, and one hundred shares thereof to be issued for each mile of said road when constructed and not otherwise."

Owned the Bonanza, Now a Pocket Hunter.

Mr. Innamill and son, of the Greenhorn country, have recently ceased prospecting in the mountains about Canyon City, where they had been for several weeks searching for pockets. During their search for pockets in that locality, they disclosed a pocket of \$180 on the Comstock, owned by Walter Brown, Dr. J. W. Ashford and Frank Sels. What other success they met with the Eagle reporter did not learn. Mr. Innamill at one time owned the famous Bonanza mine, and disposed of the property years ago to the Geisers, the owners prior to the present management, who disposed of the property about a year ago for several millions.—Long Creek Eagle.

Game Law of Oregon.

Deer, moose and mountain sheep may be killed from July 15 to November 1. Prohibited for market entirely. Spotted fawn not to be killed at all. Deer hunting prohibited between one hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise. No dogs allowed. Grouse, prairie chickens, pheasants, Chinese pheasants, quail and partridges, may be killed from August 1 to December 1. Market hunting prohibited in Chinese pheasants for three years from spring of 1899, other birds from November 15 to October 15. Trap, netting and snaring of birds prohibited. Jack snipe may be killed from September 1 to February 1. Only 15 upland birds may be killed in a day. No shooting from public highways, nor on farms without permission. Trout may be caught from April 1 to November 1, but never under five inches in length, and only with hook and line. Eastern brook trout introduced prohibited for three years from spring of '99.—Exchange.

Manager of Portland Exchange Here.

C. L. Parker, manager of the Portland Mining Stock exchange, arrived in Sumpter Friday, and will spend a week or more in this district. The Portland has not opened for business yet, but expects to within thirty days. Manager Parker is here to examine some properties, regarding which he has had some correspondence, and arrange for other stocks for his call list. The Portland exchange is very strict in its rules and regulations governing the listing of stocks, seeming to have a deadly fear of wildcats; hence the manager's trip here to make a personal examination. He has been out to the Concord with J. H. Robbins, and it is reported that this splendid property will be one of the first to be placed on the call. Late reports state that this property is about to emerge from the prospect class into that of a mine.
