It was not known then that flour could be carried on a long voyage in sacks, so Captain Leonard had 300 barrels made from lumber sawed in a mill at Oregon City, owned by Dr. McLoughlin. He took the flour to Hong Kong, where it was sold by Captain Crosby, an American in the commission business there, to a Chinese baker, and he received sio a barrel for it.
