

TEMPEST REDUCTION PLANT.

Manufacturers Agree to Put in One That Will Reduce the Ores

The Tempest mine, located in the Greenhorn mountains and owned by M. F. Bennett and others of this city, is proving to be one of the bonanzas of that rich section. The mine is an old location and has been a producer for a number of years. It being a base proposition, only the richest ores have been shipped at times to the smelters. A great deal of development work has been done on it the past season, and as depth has been obtained the ledge has proved of greater width and richer than ever. Steady shipments have been made now for some time. A party who visited the mine a short time ago informs a Democrat reporter that the pay shoot was fully ten feet wide. That is ore that will pay if reduction works were located on the ground. There were from ten inches to two feet of shipping ore.

The reporter learned yesterday that arrangements are about completed for the erection of a smelter on the ground in the spring. A California manufacturing company guaranteed to erect a plant that would successfully work the ores, at a certain figure. The owners of the Tempest concluded to accept the proposition under certain conditions, one of which was that the smelter should be erected and a trial run made of 30 or 60 days, and if it proved a success, then it would be accepted and paid for.

Our informant said that no doubt the details would be arranged before long and the smelter erected.

The Tempest has been sufficiently developed to justify a smelter being placed thereon, the only question with the owners is to be sure they make no mistake in the kind of a plant.—Democrat.

Found Pay Shoot in the Buffalo.

Dick Cox, superintendent of the Buffalo mine, was in Lawton yesterday and today shaking hands with his many friends. 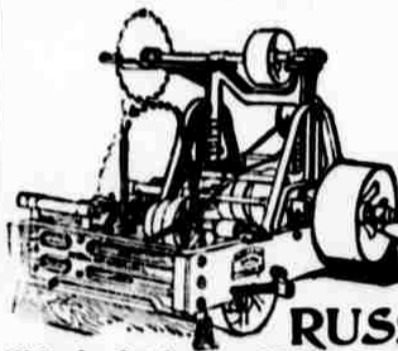
