AND now the Atchinson Globe wants the legislature to change the name of Mrs. Carrie Nation, to Helen D. Nation.

IT IS locally reported that Representative Barrett, of Grant county, will float a mining proposition in Portland soon after the adjournment of the state legislature. He is voting right along for Mr. Corbett for United States senator.

THE bill granting Sumpter a new charter, introduced by Senator Smith, has passed both houses of the legislature, but has not been signed by the governor. There is no doubt, however, but what it will receive executive approval in due time.

CLAW, Senator from Linn county, has introduced a bill prohibiting the buying of a drink in a saloon for another. These freak measures are sometimes passed by a fool legislature and approved by a governor without a backbone, but they are never enforced.

IF THAT senatorial deadlock continues at Salem, and there is no possible way of breaking it except by the election of an eastern Oregon man, THE MINER suggests Hon. E. W. Bartlett, of La Grande, as a likely subject for the sacrificial offering. The people of eastern Oregon would dislike to lose him, but would be willing to spare him for one term for the good of the whole state and nation.

UP TO Monday night but one bill introduced in the state legislature had become a law. It is a measure appropriating \$2,000 to pay the expenses of a delegation to Washington City, to lobby for the passage of a bill through congress, granting a pension to survivors of an Indian war, which tradition states was once waged in this state. PRESS dispatches of yesterday stated that A. L. Craig, of St. Paul, has been appointed to succeed W. H. Hulbert as general passenger agent of the O. R. & N., to take effect February 15. Mr. Craig has been assistant general passenger agent of the Northern Pacific, and every one familiar with the "Old Pioneer Line," knows that to be a good school in which to educate men in the passenger business. His chief, C. S. Fee, stands at the head of this department of the railroad service, and one who has had the benefit of his instruction and example must necessarily be "on to his job."

WITHOUT presuming to pronounce Recorder Manning either guilty or innocent, THE MINER ventures the opinion that those who are endeavoring to convict him of a felony are actuated by a motive of malice. Of course every one knows that the American is rancid with the virus of Manning hatred, and what it says on the subject has no weight with the public. When the new members of the council, who are pushing this case so vindictively, have served a while in that body and learn that they are hedged about by law and that their will is not supreme, they will see that they have gone about this

case without tact; that the principal result of their efforts has been to stir up an acrimonious fight.

A PRESS dispatch from Washington City states that in response to a request contained in a senate resolution of the 21st, the president has transmitted to that body the correspondence bearing upon the claim of R. E. Brown, of Spokane, a citizen of the United States, against the South African republic. The secretary of state makes a report on the subject, in which he says that Brown, on July 15, 1899, filed with the department of state an extended memorial, alleging that the denial of justice had been committed, to which he was a party, by the supreme court of the republic of South Africa, caused by the interference of the executive. The department, on account of the war and disappearance of the organized government of the South African republic, has delayed taking definite action.
