1898, none; 1899, none; 1900, 1854 feet, also miles of sidewalks built.

\$60,000 Water System.

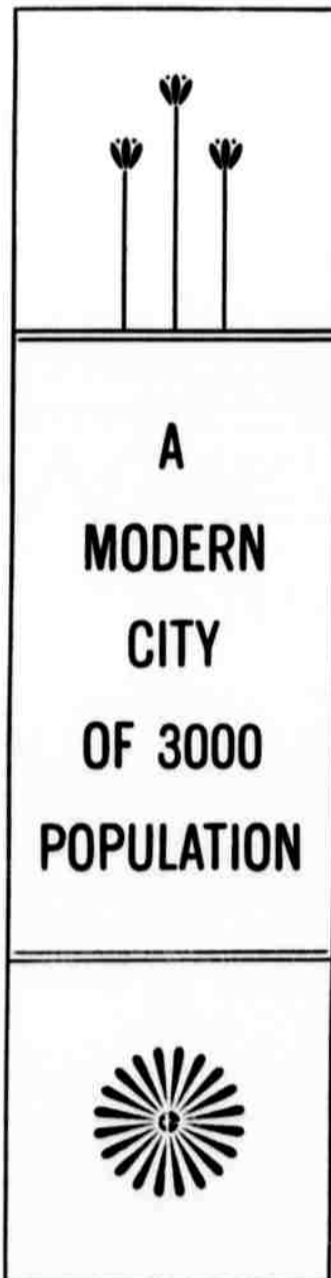
1898, none; 1899, 840,000 expended in the construction of a gravity water system; 1900, 20,000 expended in completion of same. Capacity of reservoir, 1,200,000 gallons, located 185 feet above the level of principal street; 10 inch steel mains from reservoir to business portion; 13 fire hydrants on business streets.

Fire Department.

1898, none; 1899, one chemical engine; 1900, two hose carts, 2200 feet hose, well equipped hook and ladder truck, 1 large chemical engine, 3 department buildings, hose and bell tower.

Lumber and Logs in 1900

From within seven miles of Sumpter, between twenty-five and thirty million feet was cut during the year 1900.



\$30,000 Electric Light Plant.

1890, \$3,500; 1899, 6,500 additional; 1900, 20,000 additional. Capacity of plant, 2000 incandescant and 40 arc lights. Streets well lighted.

Public Schools, 1900.

Large public school building with four rooms and one large room occupied in another building.

Freight Received.

30,000,000 pounds freight received over S. V. R. R. during 1900; 2000 cars, 270 of which were machinery for our mines. This required 7500 four-horse teams to transport it to the mines, or 20 four-horse teams each day, or one four-horse team leaving here every 30 minutes, ten hours each day, during the year.

Passengers.

Passengers over S. V. R. R. during 1899, 27,000; 1900, 33,934.

\$60,000 Transportation Outfit.

200 horses in use moving freight and passengers to the surrounding camps. Daily stages to Bourne, Granite, Red Boy, Lawton, Bonanza, Clifford, Austin, Susanville, Prairie City, John Day, Canyon City and other points.

New Brick Hotel.

\$35,000 brick hotel building in course of construction; will be completed by April 1, 1901.
