ORDINANCE NO. —

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF TAXES FOR THE REPAIR AND BETTERMENT OF STREETS AND ROADS, AND TO CREATE THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS, DEFINE HIS DUTIES AND FIX THE AMOUNT OF HIS COMPENSATION.

The City of Sumpter does ordain as follows:
Section 1. That there shall be and hereby is created a special fund of the city, which fund shall be known as the "street and road repair fund."
Section 2. All revenues collected and paid into the street and road repair fund shall be expended exclusively in the repair and betterment of streets and roads within the corporate limits of the City of Sumpter and expenses incurred in connection with the collection and expenditure of said fund.
Section 3. It is hereby made the duty of the Recorder of the City of Sumpter, to prepare an assessment roll in which shall be entered the name of every male inhabitant of the City of Sumpter between the ages of twenty-one and fifty years, excepting the names of persons who are public charges or invalids, or who have served for one year as active firemen of any organized fire department of the City of Sumpter, and said recorder shall assess each person whose name appears on said assessment roll, the sum of three dollars as a tax for the repair of streets and roads, which tax, when collected, shall be paid into the street and road repair fund.
Section 4. There is hereby levied and assessed against every male inhabitant of the City of Sumpter, between the ages of twenty-one and fifty years, except such persons as are public charges or invalids, or who have served for one year as active firemen of any organized fire department of the City of Sumpter, as shown by the Secretary's list of active firemen of the Sumpter Volunteer Fire Department, on file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Sumpter, the sum of three dollars as a tax for the year 1901, for the repair of streets and roads, and said tax, when collected, shall be paid into the street and road repair fund.
Section 5. The assessment roll provided for by this act shall, when completed, be delivered to the

City Treasurer, together with a warrant for the collection of the taxes therein set out, and said assessment roll shall be returnable within 60 days after the date of such warrant.

Section 6. Any person may, in lieu of the payment in money of the tax provided for by this ordinance, perform labor under the direction of the superintendent of streets upon the streets, roads or alleys of the City of Sumpter, at the rate of one and fifty one-hundredths dollars for each day's work, to be credited to such person upon such tax.

Section 7. Upon the receipt of the assessment roll above provided for and said warrant for the collection of said taxes, the City Treasurer shall give notice of the receipt of such warrant and assessment roll, by notice published in some daily or weekly newspaper published in the City of Sumpter, for the period of 10 days.

Section 8. All persons liable for the payment of the tax levied by this ordinance who desire to perform work in lieu of the payment of said tax in money, shall present themselves to the superintendent of streets, and he shall inform such persons of the time and place such work may be performed.

Section 9. That there shall be and hereby is created the office of Superintendent of Streets, and in addition to the duties to be performed by said Superintendent of Streets, as provided for by the Charter of the City of Sumpter, he shall have charge, under the direction of the City Treasurer, of the collection of the tax levied by this ordinance.

Section 10. All persons liable for the tax hereinbefore provided for who shall not have paid or worked out the same within 10 days from the date of the first publication of the notice hereinbefore provided for, shall thereafter be proceeded against in the manner provided for by Section 127 of the Charter.

Section 11. For the purpose of enforcing the collection of the tax provided for by this ordinance, the City Treasurer shall furnish the Superintendent of Streets with a list of the taxpayers whose names appear on said assessment roll.

Section 12. The Superintendent of Streets shall be compensated for his services in connection with the collection and expenditure of said tax as follows: For all collections made by him in cash he shall be entitled a commission of 1 1/2 per cent; for time actually employed by him in superintending work upon the streets and roads, he shall receive two dollars per day.

ORDINANCE NO. —

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT AND SUPPRESS PUBLIC DANCE HALLS.

The City of Sumpter does ordain as follows:
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation, to set up, open, conduct or maintain, or cause to be set up, opened, conducted or maintained within the corporate limits of the City of Sumpter, any public dance hall.

Section 2. A public dance hall is hereby declared to be any place, room, tent, booth or building, in which dancing is publicly carried on.

Section 3. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating Section 1 of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars.
