

## ORDINANCE NO 105.

An ordinance defining the duties and fixing the compensation of the City Attorney.

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the City Attorney, in addition to the duties required by him of the City Charter, to prepare for execution all instruments to which the City of Sumpter is a party.

Section 2. The salary of the City Attorney shall be four hundred dollars per year, payable in monthly installments by warrants drawn upon the City Treasury.

Section 3. That Ordinance Number 13, New Series, of the Town of Sumpter, entitled, "An Ordinance creating the office of City Attorney and defining his duties and fixing his compensation, passed by the Council, June 23rd., 1900," be and the same hereby is repealed.

## ORDINANCE NO 106.

An Ordinance creating the office of City Physician and defining his duties and fixing his compensation and repealing Ordinance No. 47, New Series, of the Town of Sumpter, entitled, "An Ordinance defining the duties and fixing the compensation of the City Physician for the Town of Sumpter."

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The office of City Physician of the City of Sumpter is hereby created, said City Physician to be appointed by the Mayor, and confirmed by a majority vote of the Council, in accordance with the City Charter.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the City Physician, in addition to other duties which may be imposed upon him by ordinance, to attend and prescribe for any patient within the City of Sumpter who may have a contagious disease, when requested so to do by the Marshal or the Health and Police Committee of the City Council.

Section 3. The City Physician shall receive as compensation for all duties imposed upon him by the ordinances of the City of Sumpter, the sum of Fifteen Dollars per month, payable monthly by warrants drawn upon the City Treasury.

Section 4. That Ordinance No. 47, of the Town of Sumpter, approved January 20th., 1900, entitled, "An ordinance defining the duties and fixing the compensation of the City Physician for the Town of Sumpter" be and the same is hereby repealed.

## ORDINANCE NO 107.

An ordinance creating the office of City Engineer, defining his duties and fixing the amount of his compensation, and repealing ordinance No. 38 of the Town of Sumpter, approved September 30th, 1899, entitled, "Ordinance creating the office of Civil Engineer, defining his duties and fixing his salary therefor."

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the office of City Engineer of the City of Sumpter, Baker County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby created.

Section 2. That it shall be the duty of the City Engineer, in addition to the duties imposed upon him by the City Charter, to properly establish all grades of any and all streets, alleys or public thoroughfares within the said City of Sumpter; to properly establish all grades for the building of any or all sidewalks and cross-walks, when so required to do by the Council of said City, and in general to do and perform all and every act and thing whatsoever requisite or usually done or performed by officers of that character in like cities or towns. And he shall make a report to the said Council on the first regular meeting night of said Council in each and every month, the first report thereof to be on the first meeting night in the month following the date of the appointment of a City Engineer by the Mayor of said City, and said report of the said City Engineer shall show the actual number of days worked by him,

the streets, alleys or public thoroughfares graded by him, and other work done or performed.

Section 3. That the City Engineer of the said City of Sumpter shall receive the sum of \$7.50 for each and every day actually employed in work done or performed for the said City of Sumpter.

Section 4. That Ordinance No. 38 of the Town of Sumpter, approved September 30th, 1899, entitled "Ordinance creating the office of civil engineer, defining his duties and fixing his salary therefor," be and the same hereby is repealed.

## ORDINANCE NO 108.

An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades, callings and professions, and repealing Ordinance No. 6 of the Town of Sumpter, approved May 14th, 1898, entitled, "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses."

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That no person, firm, company or corporation shall be engaged in, prosecute or carry on any trade, business, occupation, pursuit or profession within the limits of the City of Sumpter for which a license may be required by this ordinance, or any ordinance of the City of Sumpter, until he or they shall have obtained such a license as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. That any person, firm, company or corporation required by this ordinance or any ordinance of the City to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business, occupation, pursuit or profession for which a license is required, shall first pay to the City Treasurer the sum or sums required by ordinance to be paid therefor, the Treasurer issuing duplicate receipts for such payments, and thereupon, with the receipts of the City Treasurer, the same setting forth the kind of business for which license is required, such person shall apply to the Recorder, who shall issue a license to such applicant upon his compliance with the provisions of all ordinances relating to obtaining licenses for the business, trade or profession for which such license is desired.

Section 3. Every license taken out under the ordinances of the City of Sumpter, shall set forth the purpose, trade, business or profession for which such license is granted, and the name of the person taking out the same, the time for which the license is to run, the date on which the same expires, and the date on which said license was issued, and any person exercising or carrying on such trade, business or profession, or doing any act for which a license is required, shall, on demand of any city officer at his place of business, produce such license, and unless he shall do so, he may be taken and deemed to have no license, and placed under arrest by the proper officer for violation of this ordinance, and brought before the Recorder to be dealt with according to law.

Section 4. In every case where more than one of the pursuits, employments or occupations for which a license is required, shall be pursued or carried on in the same place by the same person at the same time, license must be taken out for each, according to the rates severally prescribed.

Section 5. All licenses issued under the provisions of the ordinances of the City of Sumpter shall be known as either annual, semi-annual, quarterly, weekly or daily. All annual licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year; all semi-annual licenses shall expire on the 30th. day of June and the 31st day of December, and all quarterly licenses shall expire on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September, and the 31st day of December of each year, and all annual, semi-annual and quarterly licenses issued after the beginning of the term, shall begin to run from the date of the issue of such license, and may be issued on the payment of such proportion of the whole amount charged for such term as the time for which said license runs bears to the full term, and all daily, weekly and monthly licenses may be issued at any time, but no license shall be issued for a less time than the shortest term named and provided in the ordinance providing for said license, except as otherwise especially herein provided. That where the time or manner of issuing any li-

cense shall be especially provided for by any ordinance of the city such ordinance shall control and be in force, anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding.

Section 6. All licenses shall be paid in advance in Gold and Silver Coin of the United States.

Section 7. Any person or persons, firm, company or corporation who shall engage in or prosecute within the limits of the City of Sumpter, any trade, business, or occupation, pursuit or profession, for which a license is required by this ordinance or any ordinance of the City of Sumpter without first obtaining such license as provided by ordinance, or who shall violate the terms of any ordinance of the City of Sumpter, relating to any such license shall, on conviction thereof, before the Recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than three, nor more than thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 8. Every person or association of persons who shall peddle any goods, wares or merchandise for sale within the limits of the City of Sumpter, except they be products of their own farms, gardens, or dairies, shall pay therefor the sum of Ten Dollars per quarter, but no license under this section shall be issued unless upon the payment of at least the sum of Five Dollars, for a fractional part of a quarter.

Section 9. Hawkers shall pay a license of Four Dollars per day or Ten Dollars per week. Any person who offers goods for sale by outcry on the street, or who shall conduct business from a stand on the street shall be deemed a hawker under this ordinance.

Section 10. Retail commercial travelers, who shall pursue their vocation within the limits of the City of Sumpter, shall pay a license of Five Dollars per day that he or they shall engage therein, and the term "retail commercial travelers" shall be construed to include any person or persons who shall either bargain, sell, solicit or agree to deliver, either by sample or from stock at retail to persons for their private use.

Section 11. Billiard, pool and pigeon-hole tables, and bowling alleys shall pay a license according to the number of alleys or tables belonging to or used in the building or place to be licensed. When not exceeding one alley or one table the keeper of such house shall pay a quarterly license of Three Dollars, and when exceeding one alley or one table an additional sum of Two Dollars for each additional table or alley. Every place or alley where bowls are thrown, or billiards, pool or pigeon-hole games are played, and open to the public, with or without price, shall be regarded as a bowling alley or billiard room, respectively, under this ordinance.

Section 12. Shooting galleries shall pay a quarterly license of Five Dollars. Every place or building where guns or pistols are kept for shooting at targets, whether for hire or not, shall be deemed a shooting gallery under this ordinance, but no license under this section shall be issued except upon the payment of Five Dollars.

Section 13. Theaters, plays or performances and public entertainments where an admittance fee is charged shall pay a license of Three Dollars for the first performance and Two Dollars for each additional performance.

Section 14. Keepers or proprietors of every skating rink shall pay a quarterly license of Five Dollars under this ordinance. No license under this section shall be issued except upon the payment of at least Five Dollars.

Section 15. The keepers, proprietors, managers or operators of all public swings or merry-go-rounds shall pay a license of Five Dollars for the first day and Two Dollars for each and every succeeding day that the swing or merry-go-round is open to the public.

Section 16. All public exhibitions, shows, or entertainments given by the residents of the City of Sumpter for charitable purposes or for a church shall not require license under this ordinance.

Section 17. It shall be the duty of the Marshal to see that the provisions of this ordinance are enforced, and to make complaint in the Recorder's Court for all violations thereof.

Section 18. The Recorder of the City of Sumpter, shall on the tenth day of each quarter, furnish the marshal with a list of the licenses issued, and it shall be the duty of the Marshal to arrest any person or persons liable for any license and who have not paid the same, and bring him or them before the Recorder to be dealt with according to law.

Section 19. That Ordinance No. 6

of the Town of Sumpter, approved May 14th, 1898, entitled, "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses," be and the same hereby is repealed.
