

shall bargain for, or buy any opium, in any house or place, to be smoked upon the premises, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail not exceeding twenty-five days, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Section 19. That any person or persons who shall smoke opium in any house or place, or who shall be in any house or place where opium is being smoked, without any lawful business, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding twenty-five days, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Section 20. Any person who shall solicit any person to enter or visit any house of ill-fame, or bawdy house, or any house or place for purposes of lewdness, or prostitution, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than two and a half days, nor more than twelve and a half days.

Section 21. If any person shall suffer or permit to go, or shall lead, drive or ride, or shall hitch any horse, mule, or other beast of burden, or any hogs or cattle upon any sidewalk within the corporate limits of the City of Sumpter, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than two and a half nor more than twelve and a half days.

Section 22. If any person shall remove, transfer or transport through any of the public streets of the City of Sumpter, any swill or garbage, except it be in a tightly covered box or apparatus, or in such manner as will prevent the contents thereof from being deposited in the public streets or exposed in the open air during such process of transportation, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail not less than two and one half days, nor more than ten days.

Section 23. No proprietor, manager, keeper, or bartender of any drinking shop, barroom, saloon or place where liquors are sold, shall allow or permit any piano or musical instrument to be played in any such barroom, drinking shop, saloon, or place where liquors are sold under their or his control, between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and seven o'clock in the morning. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail for not less than two and a half nor more than ten days.

Section 24. That any person who shall disturb any public meeting or assembly, gathered for religious worship, or other lawful purpose, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than twenty-five dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail for not less than two and a half or more than twelve and a half days.

Section 25. All idle or dissolute persons who have no visible means of support, or lawful occupation or employment by which to earn a living; all persons who shall be found within the limits of the City of Sumpter, begging the means of support in public places, or from house to house; or who shall procure a child or children so to do; all persons who shall live in or about, or persons who shall habitually frequent houses of ill-fame or bawdy houses, shall be deemed vagrants, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail not less than two and a half days nor more than twelve and one-half days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

Section 26. When any person is committed to the city jail on a sentence of vagrancy, it shall be the duty of the marshal of said city to cause the said vagrant to be employed at hard labor, during eight hours of each day of said period of sentence, upon any public property or other works belonging to said city, or at any other work for the said city.

Section 27. It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct any street, alley or highway within the corporate limits of the city of Sumpter, and any person

or persons violating the provisions of this section, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than two and a half days nor more than ten days.

Section 28. Each and every person who shall conduct, maintain or operate, either as owner, proprietor, lessee or employe, any nickel-in-the-slot machine or other device of like character, wherein are used cards, dice or any substitute therefor, or wherein there enters any element of chance, whether the same be played or operated for money, checks, credit or any other thing or representative of value, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars.

Section 29. Each and every person who shall as owner, proprietor, lessee or employe, permit any minor to play any nickel-in-the-slot machine shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail for not more than twenty-five days.

Section 30. In all cases of conviction for any of the offenses mentioned in this ordinance, the court may adjudge the offender to pay the costs of the prosecution, including an attorney fee of five dollars, and such offender may, in default of payment of fine and costs, be committed to the city jail for a term of imprisonment not exceeding one day for every two dollars of such fine and costs.

Section 31. That Ordinance No. 17, New Series, of the Town of Sumpter, entitled "An Ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct", be and the same hereby is repealed.
