#### ORDINANCE NO. 116.

An Ordinance establishing the curb line of streets

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the curb line on all streets eighty feet in width shall be twelve feet from the property line, and on all streets sixty feet or less in width, the curb line shall be ten feet from the

#### ORDINANCE NO. 117.

An Ordinance relating to the sale and use of opium.

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person except a druggist or physi-cian to sell or give away opium or any preparation of which opium is the prin-cipal medical agent or ingredient, to any person within the City of Sumpter, ex-cept on the prescription of a regularly licensed and practicing physician, duly licensed under the laws of Oregon, writ-ten in the English or Latin language, and the druggist filling such prescription shall keep the same on file for one year, subject to be inspected by the marshai of the City of Sumpter. Section 2. No person within the City of Sumpter shall sell any opium, or pre-paration of which opium is the principal medical agent, or ingredient, to be smoked on or about the premises where sold, or at any other place or building within the corporate limits of the City of Sumpter.

Section 3. Any building where opium is sold for the purpose of being smoked on or about the premises, or where the same is smoked within the City of Sumpter, shall be considered an opium den.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to frequent any opium den for the purpose of purchasing or smok-ing opium or any preparation in which opium is the principal medical agent or ingredient within the corporate limits of the City of Sumpter. Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof in the Re-corder's court, be punished by imprison-ment in the city jail not less than five nor more than twenty days, or shall be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, or both, in the discretion fifty dollars, or both, in the discretion of the Recorder of the said City of Sumpter.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 118.

An Ordinance relating to the storing of giant powder.

THE CITY OF SUMPTER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, company or associa-tion of persons, firm or corporation, to keep on hand or store within the corpo-rate limits of the City of Sumpter, within a distance of five hundred feet of any building occupied as a residence or for other purposes, more than fifty pounds of giant powder, or more than one thous-and giant caps, and such giant powder and caps shall be kept or stored only within a building and not otherwise. within a buildin and not othe Section 2. All giant powder which Section 2. All giant powder which any person, persons, company or asso-ciation of persons, firm or corporation, may lawfully keep on hand or store within the limits of the City of Sumpter, shall be kept on the ground floor of the building in which it is so kept, and said giant powder shall be kept in a two wheeled enclosed cart labelled "Giant Powder," and said giant powder and said cart shall be kept at no greater distance than ten feet from the front entrance of said building, in a compicuous place, so. than ten feet from the front entrance of said building, in a conspicuous place, so, as to be easily seen from the street, and said giant powder and said cart shall be so placed that they may be immediately removed from said building through the front entrance thereof without obstruetion. Section 3. Any person, persons, com-pany or association of persons, firm or

corporation violating any of the pro-visions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon con-viction in the Recorder's court, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than ten days nor more than twenty-five days. Section 4. That ordinance No. 10, New Series, of the Town of Sumpter, ap-proved May 1, 1900, entitled, "An or-dinance regulating the storing of giant powder and giant powder caps within the corporate limits of the town of Sumpter and repealing ordinance No. 11, entitled, "An ordinance regulating the handling of giant powder within the cor-porate limits of the town of Sumpter, approved June 4th, 1898" be and the same hereby is repealed.
