Years ago but few ways of extracting metallic values from ores were known to the mining world. The stamp mill was the favorite in the handling of free-milling gold and silver ores, and with fire a certain elass of rebellious ores could be successfully treated. At this point the miner and millman encountered breakers "ahead," and while many propositions of merit and value appealed to them strongly, they were compelled to ignore mining propositions which, today are being operated at a handsome profit because of the invention and discovery of methods for are treatment which were not even dreamed of twenty-five years ago. For instance, the concentrating table is of quite recent origin, and, by its use, low grade sulphide ores can be handled at a profit which were practically valuless several years ago. Low grade oxide gold ores, ten years ago, were worthless until the discovery and utilization of the cyanide process, and now base ores of low value can be successfully milled by the cyanide process after first being roasted.

Low grade copper ores are also being treated successfully at the present time that would not have been looked at by the mining operator and mill man of fifteen years ago, and this because of the fact that the pyritic smelter or roaster has become an important factor in preparing ores of this character for the "smelter stack and refinery, in addition to which several copper-leaching processes have been invented by the use of which low grade copper ores can be worked to advantage and at a profit.

Then we have new methods for the recovery of values from tailings and slimes, and, in placer mining operations, the inventive genius has perfected various appliances so that the fine and flour gold can be arrested and diverted to the copper plate or amalgam pot. The successes attending the research and untiring efforts of the millman, the metallurgist and chemist in the endeavor to perfect methods for the successful recovery of the precious metals and their by-products, have been attended by such magnificent triumps that in these days no mining project need be rejected because of the belief that this or that class of ores can not be successfully worked.
