I found a country new, in the sense of not having any foreign capital, and no machinery of modern pattern or methods for working its mines. The common system for handling ores in that section is the 'pateo,' which is a chlorination process, in which salt is thrown into the ore and tramped by mules, bringing the salt in contact with all the metal, which forms a chloride. Then quicksilver is thrown in and the same process of tramping and beating is continued. The amalgam is then retorted, which gives the product in its pure state. They save by this crude process from 50 to 70 per cent of the values in their ores. Wages in this district is 50 cents per day, Mexican silver.
