Found Nugget Worth \$108.

Nuggets, of all shapes and sizes, are so frequently found in and near this historic old town of Canyon City, that the finding last week by Messrs. Yorgenson and Hunter of an \$108 nugget while making a partial cleanup at the Humboldt company's mine in the upper end of town, caused little excitement and less comment. The nugget was about the size and shape of an average hen egg and contained but little quartz. It was found in the flume, some distance from where it was uncovered by the pipe, its shape making it easily moved by the water. The company is working some new ground and if all reports are true, will likely make some handsome cleanups during the summer. As a mineral belt, both placer and quartz, the Canyon City district is not excelled by any in eastern Oregon. All the district needs is capital and that is surely coming this way.—Blue Mountain Eagle.
