# DIXIE MEADOWS CAMP.

# Work Progressing on Several Properties In That Vicinity.

The Dixie Meadows district is rapidly assuming the appearance of a big mining camp. Sufficient development work has been done to enable those interested to determine that they are on the big lode of the great eastern Oregon gold belt. Prominent miners, many of whom have devoted a lifetime to successful mining in Colorado and other great districts, are conducting their work there with entire confidence and much warranted enthusiasm over promised results.

The Dixie Meadows Gold Mining company is developing a rich and very extensive property. Its character has already been proved. Work on its lower tunnel, now in about 150 feet, is progressing with clock-like regularity. It is expected that the big vein, cut by the upper tunnel, will be reached within the 500-foot mark. An unsurpassed mill site has been selected and it is a question of only a short time when necessary machinery will be installed to work the great body of ore already known to exist there. Millions of ore is already in sight.

The Chris Jensen property, adjoining the Dixie Meadows properties on the east, across Ruby creek, is attracting much attention from mining men who have any knowledge of that new camp. The group of claims is composed of the Ruby, Last Chance, Ophir and Dixie Pass. The tunnel on the Ruby is now in over 200 feet. In 100 feet more the big vein will be encountered, crosscutting two or three smaller veins on the way, that show up exceedingly well on the surface. The ore in these ledges is of a free milling character, in a formation of porphyritic granite. Assays of the surface rock are remarkably gosl, giving great promise of a rich strike at the depth at which the tunnel now being driven will cut it.

Among other promising properties in that camp on which development work is being vigorously done are those of J. C. Eslinger and Victor Barker, in the Olive group, consisting of the Goldie, Olive, e hite Rose, Mountain Lily and Log Cabin, and the claims of Ernest Ruof, all on the south extension of the Dixie Meadows ledge. Eslinger & Barker's Goldie is about 200 feet south of the Dixie Meadows shaft house. Work on an open cut on the Goldie is in thirty feet, striking the Gladys ledge of the Dixie Meadows company. A crosseut has been extended six feet into the vein, but is not yet through it. Excellent rock was taken out, identical with that of the Dixie Meadows. The vein will be crossent by a lower tunnel of 150 feet. Eslinger & Barker are enthusiastic over the promise of a great mine, and those who have examined the ore that they have uncovered readily confirm their opinion.

Many other claims have already been taken in that promising camp, locators being yet in the field. 
