The width of the ore shoot is over two feet and a number of very recent assays give from \$62.00 to \$80.00 per ton in gold. A sample of the ore from this find, weighing several pounds, was presented to THE MINER yesterday and, judging from this sample and the quantity of ore discovered, Sumpter can boast of another producer in the near future. The company has its winter supplies at the mine, and sinking will be carried on during the winter months.
