He learned during the evening that the Baker City council had, at a session held then, had turned down his application for a telegraph and telephone franchise, on a vote of three to two. Two of the three members who voted against his enterprise will retire from the council at an early date, when the application will be renewed. Mr. McCallum already has franchises from the county and Sumpter.
