The J. H. MacCallum company, of this city, has bonded the well known Cow Creek placer claims owned by the Eldorado Placer Gold Mining company. The property is located six miles from Lockhart, which is on the Sumpter Valley railroad. The five claims are as follows: The Newberry Placer claim, 1,500 feet in length; the Badger, 700; the Smoothbore, 1,500; the Hudson, 1,500; the Mandy Ellen, 3,000. During the prospecting operations last spring one nugget was taken out worth \$18. A cubic yard of dirt yielded \$89 in placer gold, and one pan produced \$1.50. From a hole ten feet square and eight L. T. BROCK feet deep \$195 in nuggets and gold dust was taken out. There are a great many, people in Sumpter now wearing nuggets from these claims.


