## REPORT ON

 ARTESIAN BASINS.Prol, Russell of Geological Survey Discusses Subject Affecting Large Areas in West.

In a Preliminary Report on Artevian Basine in Southwestern Idaho and no utheastern Oregon, Water-Supply and Irrigation Paper No. 78, now in press, United Statee Geological Survey, Prof. I. C. Rumell discumes a subject of great interest an affecting large areas of privute and public lande in the Weut.

The region embraced includee, in a general way, the Snake River Plains, Idaho, and large portions of Malheuy and Harney counties in Oregon. Within this region four artesian basina are noted: the Lowis or Sunke River basin, lying in both Idabo and Oregon; the Otis artesian buein, in Otis valley, sbout six milee north of Drewney; the Harney arteutian basin, in the brond valley in which lie Malheur and Harney lakes; and the Whitehorse arteuian beain, uituated about 10 milles enst of the higher portion of Stein Mountainall three in Oregon.
The portion of the Lewie arteulan basin in which flowing water may be obtained in situated along Soake River between Glenn's Ferry and Weiser, where the roeku on enob side dip toward the canyon of the river The margin of the basin in Idabo it not yot actually mapped, but within it are Included the Snake River plaine in Ellmore, Ada, and Canyon coun tien, and the country in Owyhee county which is drained by north ward-flowing streama. its boundary in still lewe deflitely its boundary in still leme definitely known, but it includes the grenter part of the northern third of Malheur county. Within these limits, the artexian head, or the elevati on below which flowing wells may be expected, is about 2500 feet above the sea.

There are no good mape of the region in Oregon embruced within the Lewis artexian basiu. A rough entimate of the as ricultural land in Idaho and Oregon lying within the Lewis arterian busin and below its known artesian hend shows It to be not lews than 1000 square miles.
Otis. Valley is astructural basia in which nbout 1900 acrem are now under irrigation, and in which about 10 or 15 square miles of good land are below the probable artexian head suggested by the elevation at which warm springs come to the aurface.
The Harney artewian basin embracee roughly the region drained by atremas towing into Malheur and Harney lakes, and includes perhape twothirde of Harney county, the leagth of the busin north and south being about 135 milee, and its breadth ease and west approximately so milee. A rough entimate baved on the genoral map of Oregon indicates that the era within which artealian water may be expected in this basin is

Includen Malheur and Harney lake and the swamps bordering them. The Whitehorse artesian basin, containing perhapa 30 equare milee of good land, liee east of Stein Mountain. The apparent shape of the rocks beneath the valley and the presence of warm springs neem to warrant a careful test of the artesian conditions of the valley with a reanonable expectation of obtaining nonable expect
flowing water.
Professor Rusmell insists that all wells drilled should be cased with Iron casing and that the records of all wells drilled in these artesian bauins should be carefully preserved,
and suggesta that, in overy state in and suggesta that, in every state in Which artesian basins occur, lawe ahould be ennoted prescribing that overy drill hole in an arteaian basin should be properly cased, that every arteainn well when not in use should oned drill hole in an artesian basin ahould be completely flled with impervious material, and that the observance of these lawe should be rigoroualy enforced.
