CABLE RETURNS  
TO SUMPTER.Well Known Mining Man Says  
This is the Best Camp in  
the Country.

Warren Cable, the veteran mining man and prospector, after whom the Cable Cove district was named, arrived in the city last week after an absence of nearly four months, during which he visited the more important camps of the east and the leading camps of the country. He says:

"While away I was in the big camps of Colorado, Arizona, California and Mexico, and I am stating plain facts when I say I failed to see anything that looked as good as the Sumpter district. Of course I saw better developed properties, bigger mines and more machinery in operation, but none of the camps which I visited, in my opinion, begin to compare with Sumpter, as far as the possibilities for becoming great mining centers go. It is my candid belief that the day is not far distant when Sumpter will be looked upon as the greatest mining city in this country.

"While I was in the east I succeeded in interesting a great many capitalists in our mines. I look for a number of them here during the summer months to invest in mining properties. They show a willingness to put their money in when they have seen for themselves the greatness of our mining possibilities."

A year ago last January Mr. Cable

sold the Adalina group in the Cracker Creek district to Pennsylvania people. Together with his brother he located some of the big properties of the district. He left Saturday for Colorado Springs on a mining deal, to be gone five or six days, and will return and make Sumpter his headquarters during the summer.

## LITIGATION ENDED.

Judge Newbury Concludes Negotiations for  
Certain Tracts of Land.

Deeds were passed last week between Marion Beamer and the Sumpter Lumber company for ten and a half acres of land forming a portion of the company's mill site. The negotiations were conducted by Judge Newbury, who is attorney for Beamer.

Judge Newbury also effected an adjustment between his client and the Sumpter Valley Railroad company for a right of way from the present Y across certain grounds in section thirty-two, township nine, range east and certain station reservations on this property which have been in litigation since the original plats were filed. The contention is now ended and the deeds have been executed.

## THINKS HE IS DEAD NEXT.

Poultryman Knows a Fake When He Sees  
It, or Imagines so.

A poultryman, of Des Moines, Iowa, with the Chinese sounding patronymic of Foy categorizes every mining proposition as a fake and thinks he is dead next to them all. President Van Vleet, of the Gold Bug property, in the course of sending out descriptive circulars, happened to have Mr. Foy on his mailing list. The circular letter merely stated that if the recipient were interested in mining investments he would be pleased to mail him a prospectus of the Gold Bug. This riled the poultryman, whose knowledge of mining is perhaps as limited as President Van Vleet's is of poultry, and he came back as follows:

"I receive five or six such letters every week, sometimes as many as three or four a day. They say there is a sucker born every minute, but I should think they would get very weary. This looks like another Letson Balliet scheme. I did think of sending this to the postoffice inspector, but concluded I wouldn't. If others want to bite, I have no objection."

An attorney back in Blauvelt, N. Y., who was evidently looking up the Gold Bug, as an investment for some client, was much disturbed over the apparent lack of harmony he saw, in the statements made in the prospectus. The other day he wrote President Van Vleet, saying that in one place it was stated the company had five full claims 600x1, 500 feet, and in another that the ledges extended a distance of 4,500 feet within the property limits.

He did not understand this and wanted to know which statement was correct. He ended by saying, "I fear this is a shadow in the path of the Gold Bug."

## Relief Map Received.

A. D. Whittier received a papier-mache relief map, showing a section about two by four miles of the mother lode system in the Cracker Creek district, last week from Portland, where it was made from data furnished by him. The map will be painted here. It will be finished in natural colors, and will show the location of all the mines, mills and tramways in this famous district. It is understood that similar maps of all the Oregon gold mining districts are to be made to exhibit at the Lewis and Clark, and at the St. Louis fairs.
