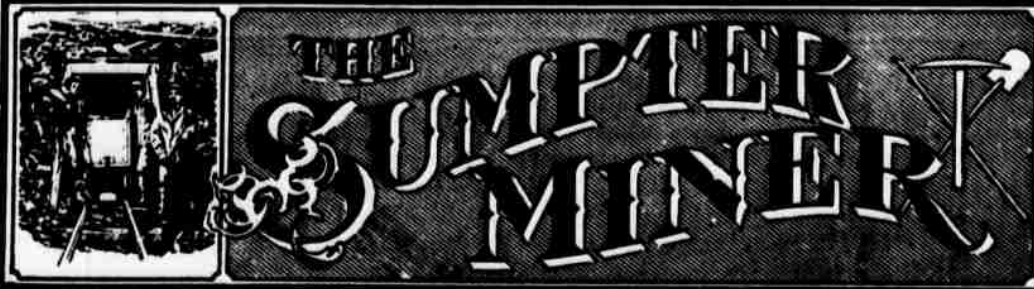

**SOUTH POLE'S  
GOOD SHOWING.**

LINE OF SAMPLES CONTAIN GOOD  
MILLING VALUES.

Yankee Jim to be Developed As Soon As  
Snow Clears Away—Good Claim—  
Joins North Pole and Has Big Ledge  
—High Values—South Pole Great  
Property.

The firm of Robbins & Robbins, assayers, handled a line of samples taken from the different workings of the South Pole this week which showed good milling values. The ore was not taken from pay shoots but it was a general line of samples from the different development work.

The South Pole company now has a force of men in its No. 3 tunnel crosscutting for the vein. The work has penetrated a distance of 600 feet and is due to crosscut the vein at any time. The vein on the No. 2 tunnel ranges from five to forty-five feet, and in one place the crosscutting was discontinued before the opposite wall was reached. The general average, however, ranges from seven to ten feet in width. This distance it is understood is in solid high grade ore, pay shoots in other words.

Just as soon as the snow goes off, and operations will not be hampered in this direction, the company will put a force of men on the Yankee Jim claim. No development work has been done on this claim to speak of, with the exception of a crosscut and a few open cuts. The Yankee Jim, however, is a gilt edged property. It joins the world famous North Pole and the surface showings have demonstrated the fact that splendid values exist. It carries an enormous width of ledge, and is among the best claims in the South Pole group.

The South Pole company is getting in a position to talk mill before long.
