STORM KING DOING GOOD WORK

**President Costello Will Crosscut Ledge When
Water Forces Him to Abandon Shaft.**

T. J. Costello, president of the Forest Mining company, operating the Storm King group, was at the property last week. Good work is being done, he says. He is still sinking and will continue to do so until the water forces him to abandon the shaft, and then he will crosscut the ledge and begin drifting on the hanging wall. The shaft is now down thirty-five feet. The Storm King has a high grade of smelting and concentrating ore. President Costello says it is too early to begin discussing a mill, but he thinks the property will be ready for one by next summer. A

road is to be built in this summer and the company will probably be ready to make some shipments by the time it is completed.

BUCKEYE TO BE DEVELOPED.

**William Gelder, Who Has Bond on Prop-
erty Will be Here June 1.**

William Gelder, of New York, who took a bond on the Buckeye group of claims in the Cracker Creek district, owned by W. H. Gleason and John Doane, last December, is expected here about the first of June to begin development work on the property.

The Buckeye group is situated one mile north of the North Pole and contains four full claims. Only the assessment work so far has been done, but the indications are that the property will develop into a first class proposition. Mr. Gleason says the ore is so rich that he could make good wages panning. Last summer he brought thirty pounds of rock from the property, which reduced and panned yielded \$1.50 in gold. This he made into a nugget stick pin for his wife.

FREE GOLD AT LISTEN LAKE.

**Ore Getting Better With Depth
and Carrying Higher Values
in Precious Metals.**

Some very unexpected developments have taken place at the Listen Lake mine in the McNamee district. Manager J. Win Wilson, while sinking a few days ago encountered a streak that shows good values in free gold that are constantly improving with depth. This was totally unexpected. The Listen Lake group is a high grade copper proposition and the appearance of free gold was entirely unlooked for. This augurs well for the property, increasing its value immensely, since there is every indication that the copper ore will carry higher gold values as greater depth is attained.

The shaft is now down some eighteen or twenty feet in good ore. It is the purpose to continue sinking and later crosscut the ledge to determine its width. It seems to be an enormous lead. Holes put down all around have been in ore good enough to ship. The Listen Lake people are very much elated over the prospects and confidently expect the property to develop into one of the big mines of the district.

The company will be in a position to begin shipping ore before long. With the completion of the Sumpter Valley extension beyond Whintey which is expected to tap the property, good transportation facilities

with easy access to the Sumpter smelter will be afforded. A hoist and other mining machinery will be installed this summer, and it is stated as probable that the company will also put in a treating plant to handle its low grade ores.

**Dr. Damerell Goes to Olive Creek Placers
to Rest and Recuperate.**
