A great quantity of ore which has heretofore been let go to waste because it was not of a sufficiently high grade to warrant it being shipped some hundreds of miles to a smelter can now be treated with profit, while ore which assays at high figures will yield a better return. oregon mining papers express the opinion that the fact that the state contained no smelter or government assay office, accounts in a great measure for the loss to the state of the credit that is due for a larger mineral production than is given by the United States Mint.
