

**CALIFORNIA'S
RICH STUFF.**

**SIX FEET UNCOVERED ON THE
SURFACE.**

One Foot of Ore Assayed From \$80 to \$310—Rest \$22—Manager Bellman Holds That Best Bodies Lie Under Summit of Divide—No. 1 Tunnel Now Thought to Be Approaching Shoot—Face in \$97 Ore.

Manager L. R. Bellman came in from the California yesterday and stated to a Miner representative that from every appearance No. 1 tunnel is beginning to break into the rich ore shoot which was uncovered on the surface a few days ago. The face of the tunnel is in \$97 ore, which argues that the rich body is being approached. It has been the theory of Manager Bellman that the highest grade

bodies of ore were to be encountered under the summit of the divide. In accordance with this belief, a few days ago when the snow had sufficiently disappeared he moved west 150 feet from No. 1 tunnel and started a cut which opened up a body six feet wide of marvelously rich ore, one foot of which ran from \$80 to \$310 and the rest averaged \$22. Work was then recommenced on No. 1 tunnel, driving ahead for the shoot uncovered on the surface, and as stated, Manager Bellman thinks he is now nearing the rich pay rock.

The shoot will be tapped at a depth of ninety feet on the No. 1 level, and the plan is to drive the lower levels forward as rapidly as possible to tap the shoot at greater depth. Tunnel No. 5 will give a depth of about 400 feet, opening up an immense stoping area.

The California now has between 50,000 and 60,000 tons valued at half a million dollars, and the richer zone has never been touched. Work will be resumed on the concentrating plant at once, and it will be pushed to completion as rapidly as possible.
