

**VIEWERS AT WORK.**

**Will Make Report On Burnt River Road In Few Days.**

County Surveyor Foster, V. R. Mead and John Doan, equipped with chainmen, axmen, packhorses and other appurtenances, left Friday afternoon to view and survey the road which it is proposed to build between Sumpter and the Burnt River valley. This preliminary work will occupy about four days, when a report will be made to the board of county commissioners, which will settle the matter of whether it is to be built or not. No doubt, however, is entertained on this score. Under the new law the county surveyor constitutes one of the viewers and the survey is made at the same time a road is viewed.

**WILL POSTPONE BUILDING MILL.**

**Sumpter Lumber Company Getting Out Logs—Plant to be Built Later.**

The Sumpter Lumber company has decided to postpone the building of its big plant here for a few months and it is stated that work

will not probably be started on it until some time this fall. The site, however, has been prepared and a log dam of good capacity constructed and everything in this direction ready to start building. Part of the frame has already been constructed.

It is the intention of the company to devote the greater part of the summer months to getting out a big supply of logs to have on hands when the mill is completed. A big force is now being worked on the company's timber lands in the vicinity.

**SEWER SYSTEM PLANS ADOPTED.**

**City Council Will Push Matters Through As Quickly As Possible.**

At the meeting of the city council Thursday night plans, specifications and estimate prepared by City Engineer Fenner for a sewer system were adopted, and the city attorney instructed to prepare an ordinance for the next meeting for calling an election to authorize the issuance of bonds covering its cost. The estimated cost, according to the engineer's report is \$15,000. It is the intention to push the matter through as rapidly as possible.

Formal charges were preferred against Marshal Rand by the police and health committee for his failing to comply with the ordinance relative to collecting fines, and his removal asked. No dishonesty was charged. Owing to the fact, however, that Mr. Rand has been granted a month's leave of absence to go to Chicago, the committee withdrew the charge until his return, and no action was taken. W. H. Mather was appointed marshal during his absence.

Ordinances were passed establishing grades on Granite street from Mill to Columbia, and on Columbia from North Street to Lot 20 in Block 11.

The report of the Streets and Public Property committee favoring the opening of Cracker, Auburn and Austin streets across the railroad track to Central addition, was accepted and the city attorney instructed to prepare ordinance covering the ground.

The contract for the city printing for the ensuing year was awarded to The Miner.

The city attorney and city recorder asked that their salaries be raised and the matter was referred to the finance committee.
