#### Some of the Party Remained to Render Further Assistance.

About fifteen of those who went from Sumpter to assist in taking care of the dead at Heppner returned Monday in company with J. W. Cowden, who acted as general manager of the band of twenty-five which left here. When the party left Heppner 170 bodies had been recovered and these were mostly women and children. It is thought that the number will reach 300 and over before the work is completed.

The rest of the Sumpter party

remained to render further assistance. It will take some time yet to complete the work of recovering the bodies, and probably some will never be found.

#### SURVEY OF STANDARD.

#### Good Showing at Property, Says Eugene Clarke.

Engineer Clarke, of Juessen & Clarke, returned Saturday from the Standard, where he made a surface and underground survey of the property. It was rather a hard undertaking, as far as the surface survey was concerned, since the mountains are exceedingly precipitous and difficult to ascent.

Mr. Clarke says that work is progressing at the Standard in a highly satisfactory manner and that an extraordinary good showing is being made.

#### At Cracker Eagle.

Engineer Clarke, returned Sunday from the Cracker Eagle, operated by the Killen, Warner, Stewart company, and brought back some fine samples from the property. He reports the mine making an exceedingly good showing.

### CUBA AND PORTO RICO BONDED.

#### Eastern People Take Over These Claims in Cracker Creek District.

Two claims known as the Cuba and Porto Rico in the Cracker Creek district, owned by Dr. Daniel Grant and Bert Rusk, of Bourne, were bonded last week to Eastern parties for \$20,000.

The property parallels the Midway and is regarded as a promising prospect. Work, it is understood, will be started within a few weeks and development prosecuted vigorously.

#### Baker County Folder.

The Miner has received a copy of a very neat and well arranged folder descriptive of the natural resources of Baker County, issued by Fred R. Mellis, of Baker City. The folder contains an excellent map of the gold belt of Eastern Oregon together with much useful information regarding the agricultural and timber resources. It has the endorsement of Mayors Carter and McColloch, of Baker and Sumpter and is being circulated by the Harriman railway system.

#### Back From the East.

Professor Eberman returned Saturday from a five weeks business trip to New York, Boston and Philadelphia. He says that business conditions in the east are somewhat unsettled on account of labor troubles. When he left New York and neighboring states were suffering from a protracted drouth.

#### Red Boy Assists Heppner.

The Red Boy and its employes came forward very generously with a

purse to assist in relieving the suffering at Heppner. The amount raised was \$120 which was forwarded yesterday to Mayor Frank R. Gilliam, of Heppner, to be expended as he thought best.
