WHEREAS, due and legal notice of the proposed improvement of that part of Auburn street bereinafter described has been given by publication as by law required and no legal remonstrance thereto has been filed by the owners liable for the cost of said improvement and the time for filing any remonstrance thereto having expired.

NOW THEREFORE, the City of Sumpter does ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. That that portion of Auburn street in said City extending from the west line of Ibex street westerly to a point where the west line of the alley in the center of block 11, Sumpter Heights, McEwen's addition to the town, now city of Sumpter, Baker County, Oregon, as shown on the plat of said addition of record in the office of the Recorder of Conveyances of Baker County, Oregon, extending southerly would intersect said Auburn street be improved by removing all obstructions therefrom, grading the same to the grade heretofore determined by C.
