

ORDINANCE NO. 201.

An Ordinance to provide for the time and manner of issuing license upon any business, trade, calling, occupation, or other thing within the City of Sumpter, and to provide for the time and manner of payment of any and all license fees imposed by the City of Sumpter and enforcement of all ordinances imposing any license or licenses, and provide for the punishment of any person violating this or any ordinance of the City of Sumpter, fixing or imposing any license, and fixing a penalty for any violation of any law or ordinance of the City of Sumpter relating to the imposing of any license and providing for the licensing and regulating of peddlers, hawkers, retail commercial travellers, billiard, pool, and pigeon-hole tables, bowling alleys, shooting galleries, theaters, skating rinks, swings, merry-go-rounds, circuses, vaudeville shows, entertainments, performances, and shows and exhibitions of every kind and nature, and repealing Ordinance No. 108, New Series, of the City of Sumpter, and Ordinance No. 6, of the town of Sumpter, approved May 14th, 1898.

The City of Sumpter Does Ordain as Follows:

Sec. 1 That no person, firm, company or corporation shall be engaged in, prosecute or carry on any trade, business, occupation, pursuit or profession within the limits of the City of Sumpter for which a license may be required by this ordinance, or any ordinance of the City of Sumpter, until he or they shall have obtained such license as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2 That any person, firm, company or corporation required by this ordinance or by any ordinance of the city to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business, occupation, pursuit or profession for which a license is required shall first pay to the City Treasurer the sum or sums required by ordinance to be paid therefor, the treasurer issuing duplicate receipts for such payments and thereupon, with the receipts of the City Treasurer, the same setting forth the kind of business for which license is required, such person shall apply to the recorder, who shall issue a license to such applicant upon his depositing one of said receipts with said recorder and compliance with all the provisions of said ordinance relating to obtaining licenses for the business, trade, or profession for which such license is desired.

Sec. 3. Every license taken out under the ordinances of the City of Sumpter, shall set forth the purpose, trade, business or profession for which such license is granted, and the name of the person taking out the same, the time for which the license is to run, the date on which the same expires, and the date on which said license was issued, and any person exercising or carrying on such trade, business or profession, or doing any act for which a license is required, shall, on demand of any city officer at his place of business, produce such license, and unless he shall do so, he may be taken and deemed to have no license, and placed under arrest by the proper officer or violation of this ordinance, and brought before the recorder to be dealt with according to law.

Sec. 4. In every case where more than one of the pursuits, employments or occupations for which a license is required, shall be pursued or carried on in the same place by the same person at the same time, li-

cense must be taken out for each, according to the rates severally prescribed.

Sec. 5. All licenses issued under these provisions of the ordinances of the City of Sumpter shall be known as either annual, semi-annual, quarterly, weekly or daily. All annual licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year; all semi-annual licenses shall expire on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December, and all quarterly licenses shall expire on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September, and the 31st day of December of each year, and all annual, semi-annual and quarterly licenses issued after the beginning of the term shall begin to run from the date of the issue of such license, and may be issued on the payment of such proportion of the whole amount charged for such term as the time for which said license shall run bears to the full term, and all daily, weekly and monthly licenses may be issued at any time, but no license shall be issued for a less time than the shortest term named and provided in the ordinance providing for said license, except as otherwise especially herein provided. That where the time or manner of issuing any license shall be especially provided for by any ordinance of the city, such ordinance shall control and be in force, anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding.

Sec. 6. All licenses shall be paid in advance in gold and silver coin of the United States.

Sec. 7. Any person or persons, firm, company or corporations who shall engage in or prosecute within the limits of the City of Sumpter, any trade, business or occupation, pursuit or profession for which a license is required by this ordinance or any ordinance of the City of Sumpter without first obtaining such license as provided by ordinance, or who shall violate the terms of any ordinance of the City of Sumpter, relating to any such license shall on conviction thereof, before the recorder, be punished by a fine not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than three, nor more than thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 8. Every person or association of persons who shall peddle any goods, wares or merchandise for sale within the limits of the City of Sumpter, except they be products of their own farms, gardens, or dairies, or article manufactured within the city limits, shall pay therefor the sum of Ten Dollars per quarter, but no license under this section shall be issued upon the payment of a less sum than Five Dollars, for a fractional part of a quarter.

Sec. 9. Hawkers shall pay a license of not less than Two nor more than One Hundred Dollars per day, the amount that any such hawker is required to pay to be fixed by the City Recorder at the time the license is applied for, and said City Recorder shall thereupon report the issuance of said license and the amount thereof to the next meeting of the City Council, and said City Council shall have the power thereupon to raise or lower the amount charged by the City Recorder and definitely fix the amount which such hawker shall pay while engaged in such business.

Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall offer for sale or advertise by outcry on the street, any goods, wares, merchandise, article, or thing, or who shall conduct any such business from a stand on the street, shall be deemed a hawker un-

der this ordinance.

Sec. 10. Retail commercial travelers who shall pursue their vocation within the limits of the City of Sumpter, shall pay a license of Five Dollars per day for each day that he or they shall engage therein, and the term "retail commercial travelers" shall be construed to include any person or persons who shall either bargain, sell, solicit or agree to deliver, either by sample or from stock at retail to persons for their private use.

Sec. 11. Billiard, pool and pigeon-hole tables, and bowling alleys shall pay a license according to the number of alleys or tables belonging to or used in the building or place to be licensed. When not exceeding one alley or one table, the keeper of such house shall pay a quarterly license of Three Dollars, and when exceeding one alley or one table an additional sum of Two Dollars for each additional table or alley. Every place or alley where bowls are thrown, or billiards, pool or pigeon-hole games are played and open to the public, with or without price, shall be regarded as a bowling alley or billiard room, respectively, under this ordinance.

Sec. 12. Shooting galleries shall pay a quarterly license of Five Dollars. Every place or building where guns or pistols are kept, either for hire or not, shall be deemed a shooting gallery under this ordinance, but no license under this section shall be issued except upon the payment of Five Dollars.

Sec. 13. Theaters, plays or performances and public entertainments where an admittance fee is charged shall pay a license of Three Dollars for the first performance and Two Dollars for each additional performance.

Sec. 14. Keepers or proprietors of every skating rink shall pay a quarterly license of Five Dollars under this ordinance. No license under this section shall be issued except upon the payment of at least Five Dollars.

Sec. 15. The keepers, proprietors, managers or operators of all public swings or merry-go-rounds shall pay a license of Five Dollars for the first day and Two Dollars for each and every succeeding day that the swing or merry-go-round is open to the public.

Sec. 16. Every person, firm, company or corporation who shall conduct and carry on at any place within the City of Sumpter, or on the public streets thereof, any circus, vaudeville show, entertainment, or performance of any kind or nature, whether the same be free or an admittance fee charged, or whether the same be conducted merely for amusement, or for advertising, or other purposes, shall pay a license fee of not less than \$5 nor more than \$100 per day for each and every day that such circus, vaudeville show, entertainment or performance shall be carried on within the limits of the City of Sumpter, the amount which any person, firm, or corporation is to pay for the privilege of carrying on the same to be fixed in the first instance by the City Recorder when the license is applied for, the City Recorder to report the issuance of such license to the first succeeding meeting of the City Council at which time the City Council shall have the power and right to raise or lower such license and definitely fix the same, the amount so fixed by the City Council to be the amount to be paid by such person, firm, company or corporation during the remaining time that it shall carry on such cir-

cus, vaudeville show, entertainment or performance.

Sec. 17. All public exhibitions, shows, or entertainments given by the residents of the City of Sumpter for charitable purposes or for a church shall not require license under this ordinance.

Sec. 18. It shall be the duty of the Marshal to see that the provisions of this ordinance are enforced, and to make complaint in the Recorder's Court for all violations thereof.

Sec. 19. The Recorder of the City of Sumpter, shall on the tenth day of each quarter, furnish the marshal with a list of the licenses issued, and it shall be the duty of the marshal to arrest any person or persons liable for any license and who have not paid the same, and bring him or them before the Recorder to be dealt with according to law.

Sec. 20. That Ordinance No. 108, new series of the City of Sumpter, approved May 29th, 1901, entitled: "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades, callings and professions, and repealing Ordinance No. 6 of the town of Sumpter, approved May 14th, 1898, entitled: 'an ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses,' be and the same is hereby repealed.

That Ordinance No. 6 of the town of Sumpter, approved May 14th, 1898, entitled: "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses," be and the same is hereby repealed.
