Ore from the Bohemia district bas been contracted for and a shipment of it is already being prepared and will arrive shortly. The Ladd Metals company is preparing to operate its own mine in Idaho, from which will be shipped a large amount of "pig copper." A smelter is being built on the ground and will be in operation within the next six months. It is not the intention of the Ladd Metals company to run the Oswego plant as a smelter, but only use it in testing, to qualify the different ores of the state. When this has been company is preparing to operate its of the state. When this has been completed the plant will be converted into a refinery.

The Oswego smelter was originally constructed to handle iron ores from mines in that vicinity, but was closed down several years ago, since which time it has remained idle.
