commended for Ore.

The Sumpter Sampling and Testing Works has completed a test of Golden Wizard ore for Superintendent Mc-Phee, with recommendations as to kind of mill suitable for its treatment. The mill best suited according to the report is stamps with amalgamation, concentration and cyandie process. This its is stated will effect a saving of over nintey-five per cent of the values. The capacity of the plant is to be 100 tons a day.

Superintendent McPhe is undecided yet whether the machinery will be ordered at once, or whether to wait till spring before attempting to install the mill. He will submit the matter to the Eastern officers. companies.
