PROVISION OF THE LAW ON PAYMENT OF TAXES

Complicated System of Rebates And Penalties, Based on Date You Pungle.

If you pay your taxes on or before March 15th you will be allowed a rebate of three per cent.

If you pay your taxes between March 15th and up to and including the first Monday in April, there will not be any rebate, and neither will there be any penalty added.

If your taxes are not paid on or before the first Monday in April they will become delinquent, when there will be added a penalty of ten per cent, and the tax will also draw interest at the rate of twelve per cent per annum in addition to the penalty.

If you pay one-half of your taxes on or before the first Monday in April then the remaining half may run up to and including the first Monday in October following; but if the last half of tax due is not paid by the first Monday of October it becomes delinquent, and there will be added to such balance a penalty of

ten per cent, and in addition such will bear interest at the rate of twelve per cent per annum from the first Monday in April until paid.

On all personal property taxes, if one-half is not paid on or before the first Monday in April, the law compels the sheriff to levy upon and collect the same after May 1st; hence to prevent a levy upon personal property after May 1st, it will be necessary for one-half to be paid as above stated.

The law compels the sheriff to sell all lands on which taxes have not been paid, and that such sale shall not be held later than March 1st of the year succeeding the year in which the tax levy is made.

The property will be sold to the person bidding the lowest rate of interest, and certificates will be issued therefor and deeds given to such property sold, unless redeemed within three years from the date of such sale. — Democrat.

WADE'S INDEBTEDNESS OVER HALF A MILLION.

The list of C. B. Wade's creditors have been filed with the referee in bankruptcy. His indebtedness aggregates more than a half million dollars. Only four claims are secured: Balfour, Guthrie & Co., \$50,000; W. H. James, \$10,000; estate of C. A. Craig, \$14,135; J. F. Temple, \$7,700. On the last note J. A. Howard, of Sumpter, is the surety.

Among the long list of creditors the following are of especial interest to Miner readers here in Sumpter: J. H. Robbins, nine notes aggregating \$25,000; Robbins & Robbins, (C. C. & W. W.) three notes for \$12,000; First National Bank, of Baker City, \$5,000; Citizens' National, \$5,000; P. Basche, \$10,000; D. W. French, \$5,000.

Regarding Mr. Wade's assets, the Pendleton East Oregonian says:

Mr. Wade's assets make a longer list than the liabilities, but this is caused by the real estate descriptions, of which there are a great many. The creditors will probably be glad to get ten cents on the dollar before all the strands of the problem are raveled out.

Nearly every mining camp in this part of the state is represented in the

stock that Mr. Wade owned. He has one and a half million shares in the Golconda, a large amount of stock in the Red Boy and scads of paper in those which have long since been buried and forgotten.

In fact, most of the assets represent this kind of securities and property. A great many of the "get-rich-quick" concerns of the east, the bubbles of which have been pricked by the law in the past short time, are represented, everything in the calendar nearly, is in the list, and are worthless in part or in whole.

TRAIN LATE ON ACCOUNT OF SNOW.

The Sumpter Valley passenger train was about two hours late this afternoon returning from Whitney, on account of the snow which fell last night and this morning. There were about eight inches additional.

The snow plow was put on the track this morning, but it made poor headway, hanging up frequently, and it was after 2 this afternoon when the train reached Whitney.
